




Atlantic Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Tropical Storm Henri SATELLITE LOOP




Tropical Storm Henri FORECAST TRACK




Tropical Storm Henri Most Likely Arrival of ts winds




Tropical Storm Henri HURRICANE WIND PROBABILITIES




Tropical Storm Henri PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST




Tropical Storm Henri 5 DAY RAINFALL









Tropical Storm Henri FLASH FLOOD RISK

Post-Tropical Cyclone Fred – Response FINAL

<u>Situation:</u> Response efforts to Post-Tropical Cyclone Fred, which produced widespread flooding & isolated tornadoes in North Carolina, continue.

Impacts: (Region IV SPORTEP, Aug 19, 11:58 a.m. ET)

- NC: 2 (-2) shelters open / 9 (-53) occupants
 - Voluntary evacuations in Haywood and Transylvania counties
 - Bottled water being supplied to the Canton area of Haywood County
 - Temporary housing solutions are being discussed and identified across impacted areas
 - Logistics support (water bottles) will continue in Haywood County as conditions stabilize

State/Local Response:

- NC EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- Governor declared a State of Emergency for 8 counties

FEMA Response:

- Region IV RWC at Monitoring; RRCC rostered
- FEMA HQ:
 - NWC coordinating with Regions, NHC, and National Water Center
 - NRCC at Level III (COVID-19)
 - Logistics: Pre-positioned 1.4M meals and 1.1M liters of water at Craig Field
 - Emergency declaration FEMA-3562-EM-FL approved Aug 16



Tropical Storm Henri – Region I Preparations

<u>Situation:</u> As of 5:00 a.m. ET, Henri was located about 780 miles SSW of Nantucket, MA. A turn toward the northwest is forecast later today, followed by a turn toward the north tonight. Henri is forecast to accelerate toward the north through early next week and approach the coast of southern New England on Sunday. Strengthening is forecast during the next few days, and Henri is expected to become a Hurricane by Saturday.

Warnings/Watches:


Storm Surge, Hurricane and Tropical Storm Watches have been issued for Long Island and the southern New England coastlines.

State / Local Preparations:

- Coordinating with states for pre-landfall declaration request
- LNO's assigned for Maine, and Rhode Island
- All states and tribes monitoring; no activation changes
- No requests for Federal assistance received

FEMA / Federal Preparations:

- Region I RRCC activated to Level II (day shift only); RWC is Monitoring; prepared to activate additional resources, if necessary
 - Type 4 power team expected to arrive Saturday to Westover
 - All major electrical providers mobilizing restoration resources from southern states.
 - Hospitals have capacity to handle potential uptick in trauma patients.
- Finalize plans for US&R Swift water capabilities
- Standing up Air Operations Branch
- Tier-1 SLB will begin on or before 6:00 p.m. Aug 21
 - IMAT FMC/Available
- FEMA HQ:
 - NRCC activated (COVID-19, Henri); NWC is monitoring



Logistics:

- SMT Atlanta deploying to Westover ARB; expected to be in place today
- Prepared to pre-stage generators and other commodities as early as Saturday
- ISB established in Westover, MA
- Alpha pack 30(+) Generators
- Additional Charlie pack being ordered with Meal's water and tarps being delivered to JBCC
- Transportation plan in development


Situation:
