


Tropical Outlook - Five Day

Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form in a day or two off the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Could become a tropical depression next week
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 5 days: Med (50%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form in a couple of days southwest of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 5 days: Low (20%)

Hurricane Larry (CAT 3) (Advisory #15 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 1.140 miles E of the Leeward Islands
- Moving WNW at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 115 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend out 35 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend out 150 miles




- Over Central America and the southern Yucatan Peninsula

National Weather Forecast










Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Tropical Cyclone Ida

<u>Situation:</u> LA power restoration remains a priority to mitigate impacts to communications, healthcare facilities, transportation, water systems, and security; flooding and debris posing challenges. Flooding and debris is posing challenges to transportation in Regions II and III.

FEMA / Federal Response:

FEMA HQ:

- NRCC at Level I, 24/7, with all ESFs and LNOs
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4611-DR-LA on Aug 29; JFO established in Baton Rouge, LA
- Emergency Declaration: Approved for LA, MS, NJ and NY
- National IMAT Red and White deployed to Baton Rouge, LA
- National IMAT Blue demobilizing from Pearl, MS
- Region VII IMAT deployed to New Orleans, LA
- Region VIII IMAT demobilizing from Harrisburg, PA (expected FMC Sep 4)
- US&R:
 - All teams are performing search and rescue operations and have swift water capabilities
 - LNO to N-IMAT Red
 - Region VI
 - Baton Rouge, LA: (1) White IST; Ponchatoula, LA: (2) Type 1 Task Forces; Lafayette,
 LA: (0 (-1)) Type 1 and (3 (+1)) Type 3 task forces
 - LNO deployed to National IMAT Red (Baton Rouge, LA)
 - All teams are performing search and rescue operations and have swift water capabilities
 - Region II
 - Hillsborough, NJ; all resources demobilized as of 8:00 a.m. ET this morning

DOD: 60 high water vehicles staged in TX; 14 rotary wing aircraft staged in TX/VA USCG: 34 air assets conducting damage assessments, investigating SAR cases USGS: Storm surge sensors deployed in LA and MS for water height monitoring EPA: Light Incident Management Team established in Region VI

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security:

- LA: Overall search and rescue activities in LA projected to reach end-state by Sep 4 Food, Water, Shelter:
- LA: 187 (+50) Boil Water Advisories in effect impacting 192k (+89k) people (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET. Sept 3)
- LA: 29 (+6) shelters open with 2,947 (+124) occupants

Health and Medical:

- LA evacuated 14 hospitals, 3 partially evacuated, 41 on generator power Energy:
- LA: 708k (-119k) (33%) customers without power (DOE Eagle-I as of 5:00 a.m. ET)
- Most areas expected to be restored by Sep 8; full restoration to heavily impacted areas by Sep 25
- U.S. Secretary of Energy authorized use of the Strategic Petroleum Reserve

Communications:

- 16 MCOVs to support command and control and site intake/registration
- 911 communications in New Orleans restored; 5 MCOVs staged and supporting Sherwood Forest ISB and 4 EOCs

Transportation:

LA: public rail closed pending assessment; Louisiana Offshore Oil Platform, South Louisiana ports remain closed; New Orleans and Lakefront airports open (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET, Sept 3)



LA EOC at Full Activation (COVID and TC Ida); Governor declared State of Emergency

FEMA Region VI Response:

- Transitioned to Monitoring
- RRCC at Level III, day shift only, with all ESFs
- IMAT-1 deployed to JFO in Baton Rouge, LA





Tropical Cyclone Ida - FEMA Region II



<u>Situation:</u> Remnants of Ida brought heavy rain, wind, and flooding to the Region. Numerous rivers are at flood stage; most are at moderate flood stage, but several are at major flood stage.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security:

- Numerous water rescues performed
- Partial building collapse in NJ with 12 injuries

Food, Water, Shelter:

- NJ: 13 (+7) shelters open with 256 (-79) occupants (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Sept 3)
- NY: 3 (+2) shelters open with 35 (+17) occupants (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Sept 3)

Health and Medical:

- 4 hospitals of concern power restoration expected today
 - Fatalities:
 - NY: 15 (+11) confirmed (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Sept 3); 9 unconfirmed (open-source media)
 - NJ: 25 (+11) confirmed (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Sept 3)

Energy:


NJ: 2k (-11k) (.05%); NY: 2k (-5k) (.02%) customer outages statewide (DOE Eagle-I as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Transportation:

- Metro North Hudson Line Limited-service restoration of early next week.
- Amtrak trains remain cancelled between Albany and New York City until 9/7
- NJ: Teterboro Airport and Newark Airport open

State/Local Response:

- NJ EOC at Full Activation (Ida); Governor declared a State of Emergency
- NY EOC at Partial Activation (COVID); Governor declared a State of Emergency
- NYC Mayor declared a State of Emergency and issued city-wide travel ban





- IMAT, DCE, and ESFs 3 and 8 deployed to NJ EOC

- LNOs deployed to NJ and NY EOCs
- Emergency Declarations approved for NY & NJ

Caldor Fire - California



<u>Situation</u>: The fire area is categorized with extreme to exceptional drought conditions, allowing fuels to be extremely receptive to spot fires. Expect most fire growth to be to the north and northeast. Response efforts continue and planning is ongoing to mitigate potential threats to communities. Increased containment on Friday night has led to a reduction in the number of mandatory evacuations as those areas to transitioned to warning areas.

Impacts:

Safety and Security:

- Mandatory evacuations in effect for nearly 43k (-7k) people from the Tahoe Basin into Nevada
- Public safety facilities threatened include Pioneer Protection district Stations, Amador-El Dorado Unit Headquarters, and the El Dorado National Forest-Pacific Ranger Station

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 8 (-1) congregate shelters open with 628 (+248) occupants (Region IX SLB as of 11:00 p.m. ET Sep.3)
- 2 non-congregate shelters open with 6 occupants (Region IX SLB as of 8:00 p.m. ET Sep.3)

Energy:

3,494 (+1.2k) customers (2.9%) without power in El Dorado County (DOE, Eagle-I as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Communications:

Critical fiber-optic infrastructure threatened, affecting essential 911 systems and cell towers
 Transportation: Numerous road closures remain in effect




