

Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located within a couple of hundred miles of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Tropical depression likely to form by midweek
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Medium (60%);5 days: High (90%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form during the next couple of days SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%);5 days: Low (10%)

Hurricane Larry (CAT 3) (Advisory #23 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 730 miles ENE of the Northern Leeward Islands
- Moving NW at 12 mph

- Hurricane-force winds extend out 70 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend out 175 miles




- Over the south-central Gulf of Mexico












Severe Weather Outlook








6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability



U.S. Monthly Drought Outlook











Tropical Cyclone Ida

<u>Situation:</u> Federal US&R mission complete, some local search and rescue activities continue; power restoration, generator distribution, responder lodging, and fuel support are priorities to mitigate impacts to communications, healthcare facilities, transportation, water systems, and security; power restoration timelines established with several communities; estimated restoration for majority of impacted areas expected by Sep 8 and Sep 29 for the more heavily impacted areas.

FEMA / Federal Response: FEMA HO:

- NRCC at Level I, 24/7, with all ESFs and LNOs; NWC is monitoring
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4611-DR-LA; JFO established in Baton Rouge, LA
- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4614-DR-NJ approved on Sep 5
- Request for Major Disaster Declaration for NY
- Emergency Declarations: approved for LA, MS, NJ and NY
- National IMAT Red and White deployed to Baton Rouge, LA
- Region VII IMAT deployed to New Orleans, LA
- MERS: Denton, Denver, Thomasville, Maynard, and Frederick supporting
- DOD: High water vehicles distributing commodities in New Orleans area
- USCG: 15 lives saved/assisted

Lifeline Impacts: (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET, Sep 6)

Safety and Security:

- LA: US&R mission complete
- Mandatory evacuations for 9 parishes continue; voluntary evacuations for 11 parishes Food, Water, Shelter:
- LA: 218 (+4) Boil Water Advisories in effect impacting 1M people; 89 water system outages affecting 83k people
- LA: 23 (-5) shelters open with 3,461 (+215) occupants (ESF-6 Open Shelter Report as of 8:11 .m.

Health and Medical:

- LA: 16 (+3) hospitals fully evacuated, 3 partially evacuated; 25 (-5) hospitals; 23 nursing homes fully evacuation; 31 (-3) nursing homes on generators
- 1 federal medical facility operational as of Sep 5
- 13 (+2) confirmed storm related fatalities


Energy:

- LA: 534k (-44k) (25%, -3%) customers without power (Eagle-I as of 6:45 a.m. ET)
- Most areas expected to be restored by Sep 8; full restoration to heavily impacted areas by Sep 25
- U.S. Secretary of Energy authorized use of the Strategic Petroleum Reserve Communications:
- 16 MCOVs to support command and control and site intake/registration
- 911 communications in New Orleans restored; 5 MCOVs staged and supporting Sherwood Forest ISB and 4 EOCs
- 89% (+3%) of commercial cell services online

Transportation:

- LA: All airports resumed normal operations; other public transportation still limited
- LA: all interstates functional with intermittent closures

 LA EOC at Full Activation (COVID and TC Ida); Governor declared State of Emergency; FEMA-4611-DR-LA, FEMA-3568-EM-LA approved

Food, Water, Shelter:

- NJ: Congregate shelters: 2 (-3) with 72 (-14) occupants (ESF-6 Open Shelter Report as of 8:11 a.m. ET)
- NY: Congregate shelters: 1 with 19 (+1) occupants; non-congregate shelters: 11 with 16 occupants (ESF-6 Open Shelter Report as of 8:11 a.m. ET)

Health and Medical:

- NY: 12 medical facilities impacted by flash flooding event; no evacuations
- Fatalities:
 - o NY: 17 (+2) confirmed
 - NJ: 27 confirmed

Energy: Minimal power outages in NY and NJ (DOE Eagle -I as 7:15 a.m. ET)

- NY and NJ: all major roads have re-opened; local detours may still be in effect

- NY: Amtrak Empire service remains suspended between NYC and Albany





CA Significant States of S

<u>Situation</u>: Last night, fire behavior was minimal to moderate, and crews continued to make progress in holding the fire within containment lines. Minimal areas of growth were seen in the northeast and southern edge of the fire where it is most active.

Impacts: (RIX SLB as of 1:48 a.m. ET, Sep 6)

Safety and Security:

- Evacuations in CA: in El Dorado County downgraded from Evacuation Orders to Warnings: South Lake Tahoe city limits and north of city of South Lake Tahoe; Evacuation Warnings lifted for El Dorado County: Ant Hill area, south of Omo Ranch Road, Springer/Leisure, south of Omo Ranch Road, Camino Heights/Newton; for Amador County: Amador County line with the western border of Highway 88 at Omo Ranch Road to Highway 88 at Tiger Creek Road, southern border of Tiger Creek Road and Salt Springs Road, and eastern border of Panther Creek road
- Evacuations in NV: repopulation of Kingsbury and stateline
