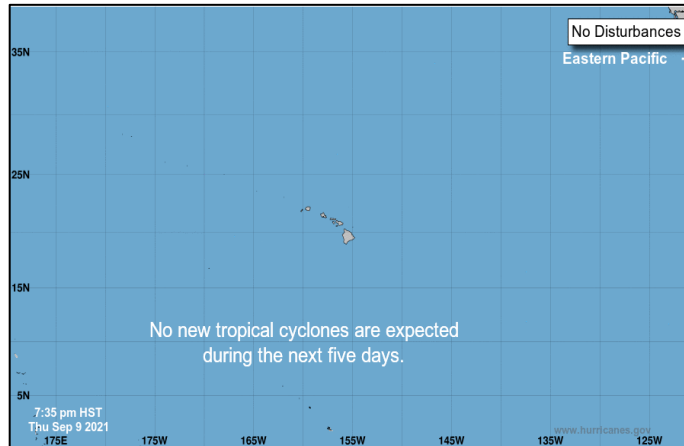

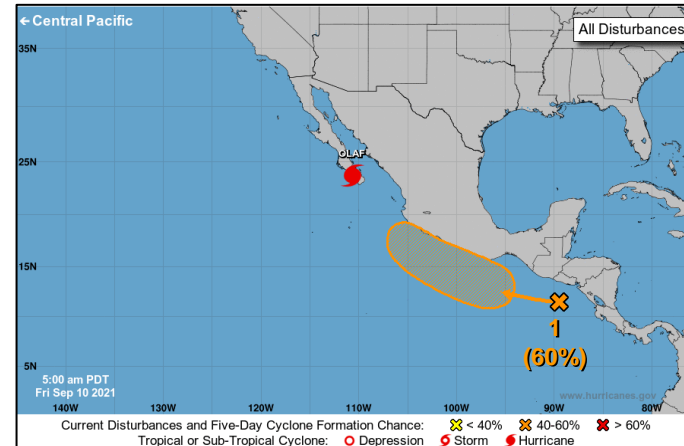

Eastern Pacific



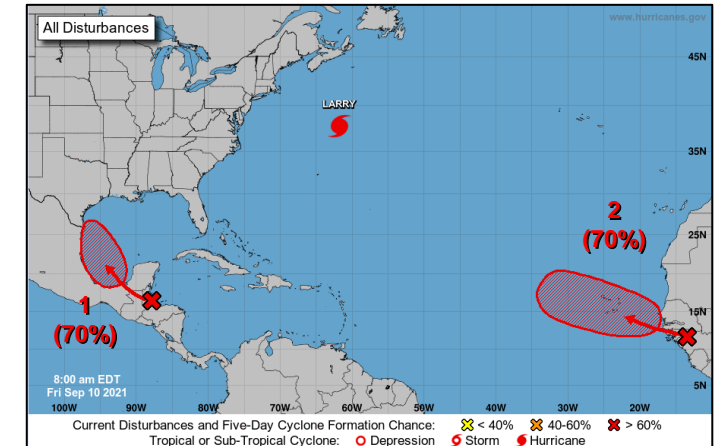
Hurricane Olaf (CAT 1) (Advisory #11 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 125 miles SE of Cabo San Lucas, Mexico
- Moving NW at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Hurricane-force-winds up to 25 miles
- Gradual weakening is expected today

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form south of the southern coast of Mexico next day or so
- Tropical depression could form late this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (30%); 5 days: Med (60%)

Atlantic



Hurricane Larry (CAT 1) (Advisory #39 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 410 miles NNE of Bermuda
- Moving NNE at 26 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to emerge in the Bay of Campeche, Gulf of Mexico
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Med (40%); 5 days: High (70%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to emerge off western coast of Africa, tonight
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Med (50%); 5 days: High (70%)

Lifeline Impacts: (Tropical Cyclone Ida SLB as of 5:00 p.m. ET, Sep 9)

Food, Water, Shelter:

- LA: 201 Boil Water Advisories in effect impacting **463k (-109K)** people; **25 (-6)** water system outages affecting 42k **(-2K)** people
- LA: 13 shelters open with 1,527 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 7:00 a.m. ET)
- NJ: Congregate shelters: 11 with 493 occupants (Region II SLB Sep 9, 2021, 1:30 p.m. ET)
- NY: Congregate shelters: 2 with 53 occupants (Region II SLB Sep 9, 2021, 1:30 p.m. ET)

Health and Medical:

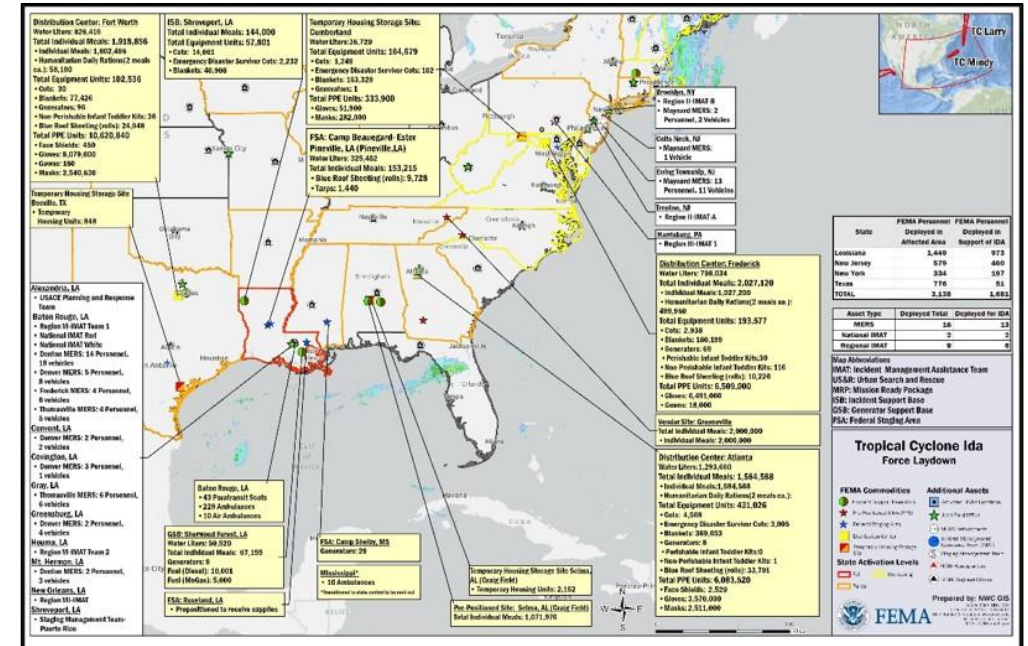
- LA: 15 hospitals fully evacuated; 12 hospitals on generator power; 13 nursing homes fully evacuated; **19 (-6)** nursing homes on generators; **44 (-2)** assisted living facilities fully evacuated, **14 (-5)** on generators

Energy:

- LA: **212k (-61k) (10%) (-3)** customers without power (DOE Eagle-I as of 4:00 a.m. ET)
- Most Entergy LA expects full restoration to heavily impacted areas by Sep 29-30
- USACE: 182 power assessments completed, 25 installations in progress, 63 installations complete

State / Local Response:

- LA EOC at Full Activation (TC Ida and COVID)
- NJ EOC at Partial Activation (Ida and COVID)
- NY EOC at Partial Activation (Ida and COVID)

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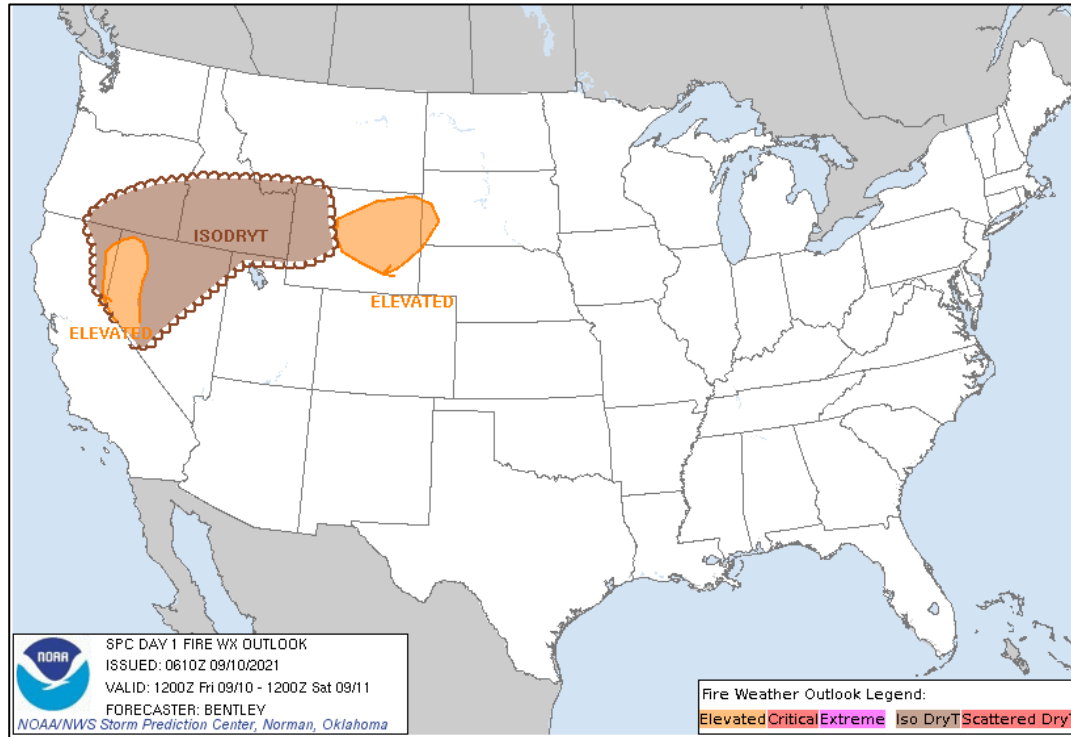
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National Weather Forecast

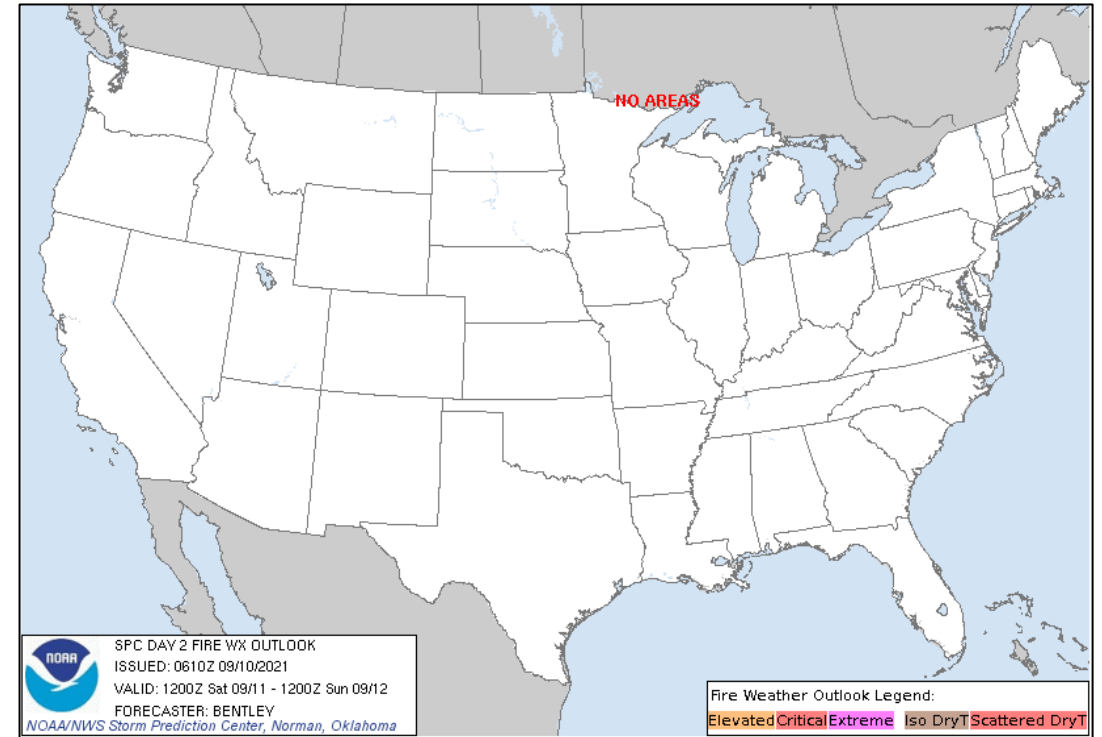


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Fire Weather Outlook



Today



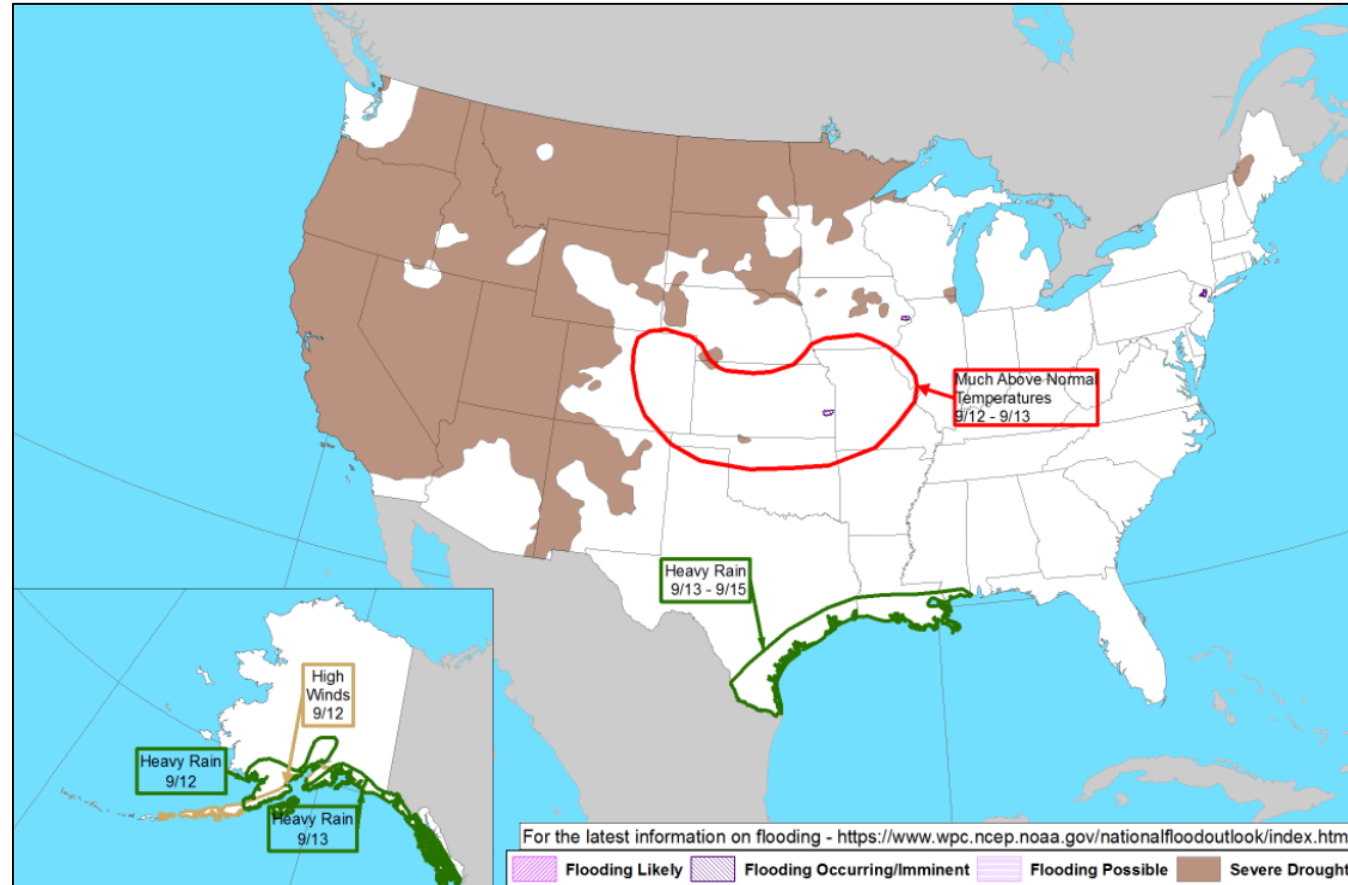

CA



Situation: Interior islands continue to burn and smolder due to poor humidity; and smoke remains a factor within active fire zones and in nearby re-populated areas. As residents return home 3 out of 5 congregate shelters were closed yesterday. Crews are working along Highway 50 to support safe repopulation. Damage inspections are in progress with 99% of structures within the current fire perimeter having been inspected to date. Individual Assistance began virtual Preliminary Damage Assessments for El Dorado County. Increasing temperatures, higher winds, and thunderstorms forecast for later in the week may increase fire activity. (FEMA-3571-EM-CA SLB as of 11:00 p.m. ET, Sep 8)

- Evacuation orders continue to be downgraded or lifted (Caldor Fire SLB as of 11:00 p.m. ET)

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 14 congregate shelters with 86 occupants; 5 non-congregate shelters with 8 occupants across CA and NV (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

Energy:

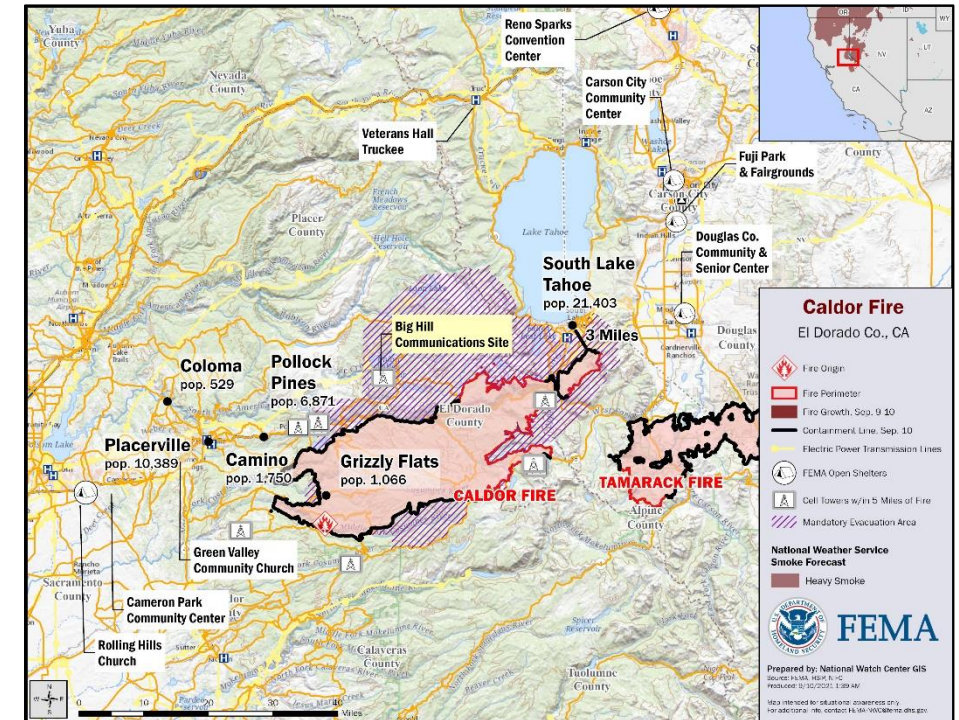
- 5,607 (+3,078) (5%) (+3) customers without power in El Dorado County (DOE Eagle-I as of 4:30 a.m. ET)

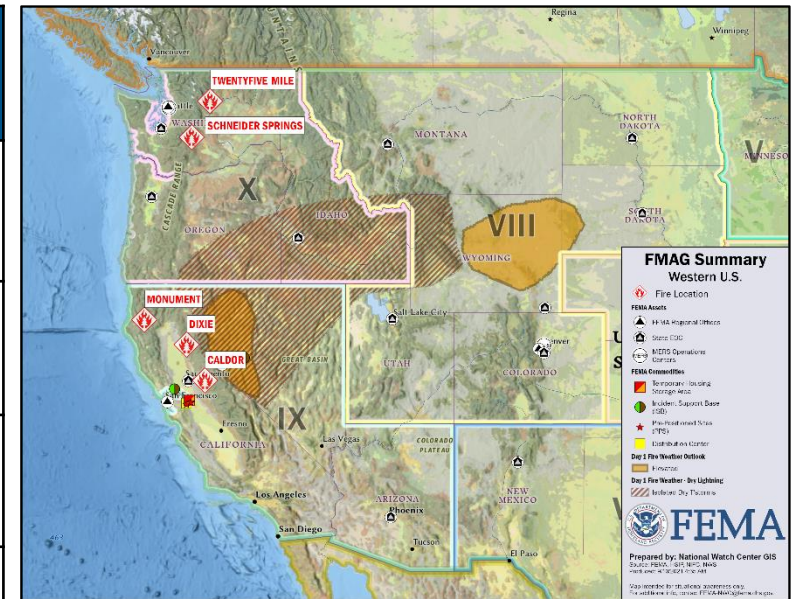
