

Tropical Depression Eighteen – Atlantic

Situation (Advisory 3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 1,860 miles ESE of the Northern Leeward Islands
- Moving W at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Could become a tropical storm later today
- Forecast to become a hurricane over the weekend





Tropical Outlook - Five Day


Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located about 1200 miles SE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (10%); 5 days: Low (10%)


Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (10%); 5 days: Low (10%)

Atlantic



<u>Tropical Depression Eighteen</u> (Advisory 3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 600 miles WNW of the westernmost Azores
- Could become a subtropical or tropical cyclone
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Med (60%); 5 days: Med (60%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Expected to move off the west coast of Africa
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (near 0%); 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Storm 20W - Western Pacific


Situation (Advisory 4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 45 miles WSW of Guam
- Moving WNW at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph; gusting up to 60 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward 160 miles in the NE, and up to 50 miles elsewhere
- Forecast to intensify over the next few days, possibly becoming a typhoon by Friday afternoon
- Tropical Storm Warnings in effect for Guam
- 2-4 inches of rain possible for Guam
- No impacts to lifelines at this time













Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall








