Kilauea Volcano, HI

- USGS detected an eruption had commenced at 9:20 pm ET on Sep 29 in Kilauea volcano within the closed area of Hawaii Volcanoes National Park
- Aviation Color Code raised from ORANGE to RED (eruption is imminent, underway, or suspected with significant emission of volcanic ash)
- Alert Level raised from WATCH to WARNING (hazardous eruption is imminent, underway or suspected)
- Activity is confined to Halema'uma'u crater and hazards will be reassessed as the eruption progresses
- Vog (volcanic smog) observed downwind of Kilauea; vog creates the potential for airborne health hazards, damages agricultural crops and other plants, and affects livestock

ADVISORY	Volcano is exhibiting signs of elevated unrest above known background level or, after a change from a higher level, volcanic activity has decreased significantly but continues to be closely monitored for possible renewed increase.					
WATCH	Volcano is exhibiting heightened or escalating unrest with increased potential of eruption, timeframe uncertain, OR eruption is underway but poses limited hazards.					
WARNING	Hazardous eruption is imminent, underway, or suspected.					

When the	volcano color code changes, a Volcano Observatory Notification for Aviation (VONA) is issued.
GREEN	Volcano is in typical background, non-eruptive state or, after a change from a higher level, volcanic activity has ceased and volcano has returned to noneruptive background state.
YELLOW	Volcano is exhibiting signs of elevated unrest above known background level or, after a change from a higher level, volcanic activity has decreased significantly but continues to be closely monitored for possible renewed increase.
ORANGE	Volcano is exhibiting heightened or escalating unrest with increased potential of eruption, timeframe uncertain, OR eruption is underway with no or minor volcanic-ash emissions [ash-plume height specified, if possible].
RED	Eruption is imminent with significant emission of volcanic ash into the atmosphere likely OR eruption is underway or suspected with significant emission of volcanic ash into the atmosphere [ash-plume heldnt specified, if possible].








Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,500 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Tropical depression could form over the weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%); 5 days: Medium (40%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A couple of hundred miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%); 5 days: Low (10%)

Atlantic



Hurricane Sam (CAT 4) (Advisory #31A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 355 miles NE of northern Leeward Islands
- Maximum sustained winds 145 mph
- Moving NW at 12 mph
- Will continue to pass well NE of northern Leeward Islands this morning and pass east of Bermuda early Saturday

Tropical Storm Victor (Advisory #4 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 550 miles SSW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Could become a hurricane on Friday




- Located over the tropical Atlantic about midway between the Cabo Verde Islands and Lesser Antilles
- Formation chance: 48 hours: Low (Near 0%); 5 days: Low (Near 0%)



National Weather Forecast











Severe Weather Outlook




