### • Maintenance of Effort (MOE)

The MOE Expenditure Table was due by October 31, 2021, for PSUs with approved IDEA grants. The MOE Expenditure Table is a federal requirement, and the grant will remain open for late submission. ### • Special Grants

Special grants, with the status of Chief Administrator Approved, are reviewed monthly after the 15th. Notification of review is made through NC CCIP. For your review, the Special Grants Training recording, along with the PowerPoint are available on the EC Website <u>here</u> under the Special Grants section.

• IDEA/ American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP)

The American Rescue Plan funds have been allotted under the following Program Report Codes. The budgets will be submitted the same way as the IDEA budgets. A new application is not required.

### PRC 185 IDEA/American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) Basic – 611

The funds will align with the IDEA Section 611 Use of Funds. If the funds are budgeted for items not currently in the Section 611 Use of Funds, the Use of Funds must be revised.

## PRC 186 IDEA/American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) Preschool – 619

The funds will align with the IDEA Section 619 Use of Funds. If the funds are budgeted for items not currently in the Section 619 Use of Funds, the Use of Funds must be revised.

## PRC 187 IDEA/American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) CEIS

For PSUs with mandatory CEIS, the funds will align with the CEIS Use of Funds. If the funds are budgeted for items not currently in the CEIS Use of Funds, the Use of Funds must be revised.

For PSUs with an approved IDEA grant and needing a grant revision, it should be submitted at the same time as your MOE Expenditures. Contact your fiscal monitor for additional information regarding the IDEA grant status and the submission of the budgets.

- Allotments can be seen on the allotment page of the IDEA Grant in CCIP
- Budgets are submitted through each PSU's budgeting system and will be pulled into CCIP

   Directors/Coordinators can view the budgets once submitted by clicking on the
   budget link on the IDEA Grant Sections page

 The funds can be utilized on any IDEA allowable expense. The Chart of Accounts now contains the allowable budget codes for PRC 185, 186 & 187. - If the budget aligns with the current Section 611/619 and or CEIS Use of Funds, the IDEA Grant does not need to be revised.
- If the budget includes line items not currently in the Section 611/619 or CEIS Use of Funds, the IDEA Grant must be revised to include the new line items. Designate in the Use of Funds that the revision items are for PRC 185/186/187.



## IMPORTANT: Child Count: Out-of-State Transfers/Comparable Service Plan/Initial Timeline

During this morning's office hours, a number of clarifying questions were raised regarding how to count incoming out-of-state students. The following decision tree will be helpful in determining whether the student may be counted.



<u>Please remember</u>: Out-of-state students that were eligible in another state arrive in NC with a suspected disability. Therefore, an initial referral must be started, and comparable services provided. If the initial referral timeline goes over 90 days and eligibility in NC has not been determined with a

current NC IEP in place (if eligible with parent consent for services provided), the student cannot be counted on child count. \*This is consistent with any student in the initial referral process that has not been determined eligible in NC with a current NC IEP in place on December 1/April 1.

### **NC-ELN Child Outcomes Summary Resources**

Children with and without disabilities make progress, grow and develop. Preschool programs support and guide children as they take steps forward to goals that parents and teachers think are important. In 2005, the Office of Special Education Programs in the US Department of Education funded the Early Childhood Outcomes Center (resources now under ECTA) to help states develop a measurement process to gauge the effectiveness of special education programs based on the outcomes of children with disabilities as a result of receiving special education and related services.

Understanding the three child outcomes and learning how to accurately measure a child's early childhood outcome performance is a key focus of Network training. Support and training is also available to expand teaching practices that facilitate young children's development and learning in the early childhood outcomes areas, particularly in social-emotional development, early literacy, embedded instruction and in developing and implementing functional Individualized Educational Programs (IEPs).
