### SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST GRANT PROGAM (PRC 204)

## **School Psychology Grant Program**

Session Law 2021-189 established a grant opportunity intended to recruit school psychologists in hard-to-staff areas. School psychologists play an integral role in improving the safety, mental health, and well-being of students and are a vital part of Public-School Units (PSUs). Given the timeline described below, PSUs may apply for this grant if they intend to hire a school psychologist or provide professional learning and mentorship between now and April 1, 2024 (i.e., a candidate does not have to be confirmed or hired to apply for the grant).

### **Grant Details**

The grant application can be accessed and completed within the North Carolina Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Plan (CCIP) grant system.

- Application Window: 4/20/2022 5/31/2022
- Expected Allotment Date: 7/31/2022\*
- Funds are available through September 30, 2024.

\*Please note the expected allotment date of 7/31/22. Any funds not encumbered by April 1, 2024, will be reverted for redistribution.

#### Acceptable Use:

These grant funds can be used for the following recruitment activities:

- Individual bonuses
- Professional membership fees
- Professional learning (e.g., registration and per diem)
- Mentor support stipend

# **Special Criteria:**

- NCDPI will prioritize the award of funds to public school units that do not currently employ a full-time school psychologist
- No individual bonus shall be greater than \$5,000
- No individual professional learning cost shall be greater than \$5,000
- No school psychologist shall receive more than \$5,000 annually for provision of mentorship
- As a condition of accepting a signing bonus, a school psychologist shall agree through an assurance agreement to remain employed in the public-school unit for at least one school year

- Grant funds shall be used to supplement and not supplant State or non-State funds already provided for the activities described above
- Funds shall not be used for contracted services
- Application must be completed and submitted by the PSU upper-level administrator who has school psychologist supervision responsibility (Director of Exceptional Children, Director of Student Services, Assistant Superintendent, etc.)
