Charter School NPI Enrollment

NC Charter Schools applying for an *National Provider Identifier* (NPI) number (in preparation for Medicaid reimbursement of qualifying health services provided at school) will enroll under taxonomy code **251300000X**. Available taxonomies and criteria are outlined in the <u>Provider Permission Matrix on NCTracks</u>. The Medicaid provider enrollment application and FAQs can be found on the <u>Getting Started With Enrollment web page of NCTracks</u>. Provider User Guides and Fact sheets are also available <u>NCTracks</u>.

The NPI Registry Public Search is a free directory of all active NPI records. Healthcare providers acquire their unique 10-digit NPIs to identify themselves in a standard way throughout their industry. Individuals or organizations apply for NPIs through the *National Plan and Provider Enumeration System* (NPPES).

Methodologies and Evidence-Based Practices with Autism Spectrum Disorder

In some cases, these EBPs are applied systematically in unique combinations resulting in a methodology, such as Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). The PSU can start a revision after the grant has been approved and make any changes necessary for the alignment of the Use of Funds and the budget. The grant revision and the budget revision will be reviewed by the fiscal consultant after submission of the revision. The revision cannot be indicated in the history log.

• Revisions to CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant (PRC 167)

When a revision is made to the CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant PRC 167 budget, the grant narrative Use of Funds must align with the budget. If a Use of Funds revision is needed, it must be made in the 2021 CARES Act-ESSERF-Exceptional Children Grant application. The PSU can start a revision after the grant has been approved and make any changes necessary for the alignment of the Use of Funds and the budget. The grant revision and the budget revision will be reviewed by the fiscal consultant after submission of the revision. The revision cannot be indicated in the history log of the grant application.

PRC 029 Funds 2022-2023 Updates

Please review your 2021-2022 PRC 029 budget and ensure all funds will be encumbered by **Thursday, June 30**, **2022**.

PRC 029 Request for Funding is now OPEN

The application process for the PRC 029 grant is open for the 2022-2023 school year. A special budget provision in the 1999 Appropriation Act modified the use of these state dollars to allow expenditure of PRC 029 funds to provide services to "(i) children with special needs who were identified as members of the Willie M class at the time of dissolution of the class, and (ii) other children with special needs." This provision provides the flexibility for PSUs to use these PRC 029 funds for services for students who have significant behavioral and emotional needs in public schools.

This application process will allow PSUs to complete a Comprehensive Needs Grant. The final submission deadline is **Friday, July 1, 2022**.

The application requires each PSU to identify services and indicators that measure the effectiveness of these supports. Prioritization will be given to innovative grant proposals that are designed to address the critical need for identified students.

All students eligible for PRC 029 services must have a completed <u>Entrance Tool</u>. The Entrance Tool must be submitted during the time that the grant is open.
