The Court is governed by the laws of the State of Washington and the Chief Justice's Emergency Orders. The Court has been deemed an "essential" function by the Governor.

This Order is intended to continue several important new methods of doing business that will be enforced by judicial officers and to update previous orders to reflect current conditions. The Court is in a unique position in that many witnesses, parties, and jurors are ordered to appear at the courthouse. Additionally, the Court has hundreds of employees who report to work at the courthouses daily. Both the vaccinated and unvaccinated must be allowed access to the courts. The Court is cognizant of its responsibility to keep all people who enter the courthouse safe. To that end, the Court will continue to implement its safety protocols to deter the spread of COVID-19. The Court has promulgated public health guidelines for those who visit in-person, which include the requirement to wear a mask.

The Court has adopted widespread use of video and telephonic technologies and found the use of this technology to be very successful. Since the start of this pandemic, the Court has conducted over 1000 remote bench trials and over 300 jury trials (190 criminal, 110 civil (40 in person and 70 all remote).³ Voir dire has been conducted virtually for all jury trials. The trials have proceeded smoothly. By adopting video technology, the Court has been able to provide justice during the pandemic.

The Court ORDERS the following for the duration of the period January 18, 2021 through February 11, 2022 only:

- 1. Criminal jury trials: No criminal jury trials shall be started from the date of this Order through February 11, 2022. Current criminal trials shall continue to completion. Juvenile bench trials may be held in person at the discretion of the Chief of the Clark Children and Family Justice Center.

1	2. Civil bench and jury trials: Emergency Order 33 remains in place. Most civil trials shall be
2	held virtually but with prior court approval, in-person proceedings for civil jury trials may
3	be conducted, notably those few currently in process. All trials of all case types currently
4	in progress shall continue to completion.

6	This Order expires February 11 th 2022 close of business.
