# Heavy Rain and Potential Flooding - California

<u>Current Situation:</u> A strong atmospheric river storm system will impact portions of California and Nevada with rain, snow, isolated thunderstorms, and gusty winds through Sunday. The heaviest precipitation is expected through Friday evening. Additional snow accumulation of 2-8 feet is forecast across the Sierra Nevada. Winds of 40-50 mph are expected with gusts reaching 60 mph. The combination of heavy rain and snowmelt will lead to an increasing flooding threat. There is a high risk of excessive rainfall in central coastal CA and interior central valleys.

#### **Potential Impacts:**


- Flash, urban, and small stream flooding, minor to moderate river flooding, and shallow mudslides or debris flows on burn scars are possible; storm drains and ditches may become clogged with debris
- Difficult to impossible travel conditions due to reduced visibility, high snowfall rates, and strong winds
- Additional snowfall on top of already heavy snowpack could increase snow-load on structures
- Evacuation Orders issued for Newman, Oceano, Planada; open shelters in Stanislaus, San Luis Obispo,
   Merced, San Bernadino, Butte, San Benito, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Fresno, and Madera county (approx...
   120 occupants)
- San Joaquin and Sacramento valleys are the areas most likely to exceed monitor or flood stage

#### State / Local Response:

- CA EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19, Seismic Activity, Flooding); CA requested 500k sandbags, the Governor
  declared a state of emergency for 21 counties and requested a EM declaration for CA
- NV EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)

#### FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region IX RWC and the NWC continue to monitor; Region IX continues to coordinate closely with CA and NV EOCs and the NWS; Region IX deployed 1 LNO to CA, 1 LNO is deploying to NV
- Region IX IMAT-1 and IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC (FEMA-4683-DR-CA)
- USACE is coordinating with CA; sourcing sandbags and working to deliver them to CA
- The US&R Red Incident Support Team is rostered and prepared to deploy if needed; and US&R resources with full water rescue capability are available to support R IX as required
- No requests for FEMA assistance






# Additional Precip Through 4 PM PST Saturday, March 11, 2023




Widespread 1 to 3 inches of precipitation has already fallen in the last 24 hours in northern and central California.



### California – RFC River Forecasts / 5-Day Forecast Rainfall


