Post Pandemic: Parent Access to Programs

During the nationally declared pandemic of the COVID-19 virus, Child Care Services allowed child care programs, both Family Child Care Homes and Center based programs, to limit access of parents to their child care facilities. This was an effort to reduce the exposure, risk, and spread of COVID-19 and its variants, and more importantly, to protect the health and safety of children in care and the employees of child care programs who continued to provide much needed services to families.

President Biden has now declared an end to the COVID-19 pandemic. Following along with the President's statement, Child Care Services will resume enforcing the licensing requirement that parents are allowed reasonable access to areas of child care facilities that are used by children.

This requirement can be found in Section 89.1(d) of Licensing Requirements for Family Child Care Homes and in Section 293(c) of Licensing Requirements for Child Care Programs.) Programs will need to begin making any necessary changes to current practices to meet these requirements. As always, programs are encouraged to seek guidance from the State Department of Health or from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) regarding any communicable disease or health concern.



We want to ensure all programs are successful. Therefore, the Star monitoring reviews throughout 2023 will be discussion visits only! Criteria violations will not be documented. This will allow you time to learn and properly implement the Stars criteria. Full monitoring is expected to resume in January 2024.

However, the last 24 months of licensing monitoring will continue to be reviewed and numerous, repeated or serious non-compliances with minimum licensing requirements will be documented and may result in stars reduction.



We will be sending a ListServ message via email in the near future regarding all Child Care Pandemic supports. This message will include important dates and information for initiatives such as family copayments, free child care for essential workers / child care personnel, absent days, grants and more. The Quality & Stabilization Grant

WHAT: Cycles 7 - 9 Quality & Stabilization GrantWHEN: Cycle 8 opens April 1st and closes April 30WHY: Quality & Stabilization SupportWHO: ALL PROVIDERS!

Additional Information

Cycles 7-9 offers a doubled payment amount and an additional percentage increase based on the program's new star rating on January 1, 2023.

Examples:

• A Five Star Home with a capacity of 7 will receive the doubled base amount of \$6,000 + 175% increase = \$16,500.

• A Five Star Center with a capacity of 50 will receive the doubled base amount of \$22,000 + 175% increase = \$60,500.

The Workforce Support Grant

- WHAT: Bonus Payment for Child Care Staff
- WHEN: LAST CYCLE 4 opens April 1, 2023 (Staff qualify for only 1 bonus)
- WHY: Child Care Staff Retention & Recruitment Support
- WHO: Child care employees working in a permitted or licensed program

Home Address in the Registry Must be Current!

Workforce debit cards are mailed to the HOME ADDRESS the participant has listed in their Oklahoma Registry individual account. Participants can update their HOME ADDRESS by logging into their Registry account and updating their Personal Information. If there is a statement in the account that says, READ ONLY, they should complete

Subsidy Spotlight ______ RECORDING ATTENDANCE FOR SCHOOL AGE

CHILDREN WHO ATTEND PART-TIME

As you are aware, OKDHS is currently reimbursing providers at a fulltime rate for school-age children even when they only attend part-time (four hours or less per day).

To ensure accurate payment and avoid overpayments, Child Care Providers have the option of either:

 requiring parents complete a single "in" swipe, or
requiring parents complete four swipes (to capture each arrival and departure time to and from school) per day on those days that part-time before and after school care is needed.

<u>Children who attend school full-time should never be swiped in all day</u> <u>while they are at school (one "in" swipe and one "out" swipe).</u> Although OKDHS is currently reimbursing part time attendance with full time pay as part of our COVID initiatives, these part-time days do not count towards the minimum number of days required for absent day payments. Thus, it is imperative the swiping rules above be followed to ensure you don't incur an overpayment which must be paid back. Oklahoma Human Services has been working to modernize the agency, its processes and services with new technologies to better serve our customers, providers and workforce. The old Child Care Locator was definitively not modern, and lacked functionality to fully paint the picture of the quality work your programs do in the community.

Our new Child Care Locator is much more user-friendly and has a whole host of features to better serve Oklahoma's families and meet federal requirements:

• Advanced search and mapping tools allow users to find child care programs within a certain radius of desired locations. This functionality will even map programs that exist along a route if families are searching for a child care program between their home and work locations, for example.

• New monitoring visit summaries show the entirety of compliance checks instead of only items that are out-of-compliance.

o **This new functionality is a federal requirement**, but it also better demonstrates the depth and breadth of your program's compliance with health and safety standards rather than only focusing on areas of non-compliance. The new monitoring checklist shows families the many ways you are working to keep their child safe and healthy in a quality learning environment!

• A refreshed look and feel makes the Child Care Locator look as modern as its new functionality.

Like the previous Child Care Locator, this one still offers search filters like facility type, Star level and subsidy acceptance, to name a few, along with details about your program like capacity, hours and program features.

Future updates to this new Child Care Locator will also include a provider portal, so stay tuned for more exciting information about enhanced functionality!

Thank you for the work you do every day to provide safe, quality early childhood learning environments for Oklahoma's families! We are excited for the many ways this new Child Care Locator will highlight your important work and improve the accuracy and ease for families searching for your programs.


Pyramid Model Peer Learning Communities


