Why Focus on Older Adults?

The U.S. population is rapidly aging, and the U.S. Census Bureau projects that, by the year 2035, there will be more Americans who are 65 and older than there will be children under the age of 18. As of 2018, there were over 52 million adults ages 65 and older.

Older adults are a very diverse group, with varying life experiences and capabilities. In many cases, older adults demonstrate greater resilience in the face of disasters than younger populations.

However, since many disasters and emergencies disproportionately impact the older adult population, especially older adults ages 85 and older, it is important to understand how to identify and address the specific needs of older adults during a disaster or emergency.







Region 4 (AL, FL, GA, KY, MS, NC, SC, TN)

DR-4684-AL:

- Disaster survivors can visit Russell Do It Center in Prattville to speak with FEMA mitigation specialists about their damage and discuss how to best repair their homes: Russell Do It Center, 2006 Cobbs Ford Road, Prattville, AL 36066. Hours: 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Thursday, March 9 and Friday, March 10; 7:30 a.m. to noon, Saturday, March 11; 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday, March 13; 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Tuesday, March 14.
- The Disaster Recovery Center in Sumter County will close permanently March 10.

DR-4685-GA:

• The Spalding County Disaster Recovery Center in Griffin will close at 6 p.m. Friday, March 17.

DR-4645-TN:

 Federal disaster assistance has been approved for state and eligible local governments and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe winter storm in Cocke, Coffee, Davidson, Greene, Henderson, Knox, Maury, Perry, Putnam, Shelby and Washington counties.

Region 5 (MN, WI, IL, IN, MI, OH)

East Palestine, Ohio Train Derailment:

Norfolk Southern is offering financing assistance for temporary lodging and other expenses, such as travel, food, clothing, and other necessities. This program is voluntary and is being provided as an option and a resource to interested residents to ensure they feel comfortable throughout the track excavation work. Residents should contact the Norfolk Southern resource hotline at 800-230-7049 (open 24 hours) or visit the Family Assistance Center at Abundant Life Church in New Waterford, Ohio. Residents can also contact EPA at 866-361-0526 for additional guidance about available resources.

Region 6 (AR, LA, OK, NM, TX)

DR-4611-LA:

- FEMA has approved the state of Louisiana's request to extend the financial period of assistance for eligible Hurricane Ida survivors, including the Individual and Households Program appeal deadline. FEMA approved a three-month extension, authorizing the financial assistance program through June 1st, 2023.
- VALs have received 2491 referrals; 2455 of those cases are closed and 36 are open \VALs
 have received 2853 Duplication of Benefits requests from disaster case management
 agencies and have completed 2835 to date.
- VALs have assisted applicants receive \$2.1 million in additional IHP funding through case review and appeals.
- 805 Homes have been repaired/rebuilt and 336 homes are pending home repairs/rebuilding from voluntary agencies disaster wide.

Muscogee Creek Nation:

- FEMA announced that federal disaster assistance has been made available to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and ordered federal aid to supplement the tribe's efforts in the areas affected by the severe winter storm from Dec. 21-25, 2022.
- Federal funding is available to the Tribal Nation on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe winter storm.
- Federal funding is also available on a cost-sharing basis for hazard mitigation measures

Region 9 (CA, NV, AR, HI, Guam, Northern Mariana, American Samoa)

DR-4683-CA:

FEMA launched a hiring process to continue its support of California's recovery from the
winter storms and flooding. Those interested in a temporary position can apply through
<u>USAJobs.gov</u>. Applicants will be called for interviews at a later date. Positions are available
for planners, environmentalists, and IT specialists among others in Chico, Oakland, Pasadena
and Sacramento.

FEMA Publishes Pre-Disaster Mitigation Funding Notice

On March 1, FEMA published the Fiscal Year 2023 Notice of Funding Opportunity on <u>Grants.gov</u>. This funding opportunity makes approximately \$233 million available to support 100 resilience-related projects nationwide.

The projects—funded by the <u>Pre-Disaster Mitigation</u> program—were congressionally authorized through the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, signed by the President on Dec. 29, 2022. This funding is in addition to the amounts provided through other <u>FEMA hazard mitigation grant programs</u> for projects that support growing needs nationwide to make communities more resilient to natural hazards. Most of the projects focus on infrastructure improvements to stormwater, drainage, sewer and levee systems and dams to make communities and tribes more resilient from flooding. Others address hazards like tsunamis, seismic activity, landslides and wildfires.

Communities and tribal nations with projects identified in the funding opportunity must apply for funding by 5 p.m. ET on April 14. While all awards must be made before Sept. 30, the funds will not be dispersed until all the Hazard Mitigation Assistance program requirements have been met such as compliance Environmental and Historic Preservation requirements.
