Heavy Rain and Flooding - California and Nevada

Current Situation: (NOAA California Key Points as of Mar 11, 11:00 p.m. ET)

Another atmospheric river will arrive today through Wednesday, bringing widespread rain, mountain snow, and strong winds. Scattered thunderstorms will continue bringing a risk for local flash flooding and hail.

Lifeline Impacts: (EM-3592-CA SLB as of Mar 12, 11:00 p.m. ET)

Safety and Security:

- Mandatory Evacuations Orders: 15k (+9k) residents in 10 counties
- Evacuation Warnings: 54k (+14k) residents in 10 counties

Health and Medical:

- CA: 2 confirmed storm-related fatalities
- Tulare County: Sierra Care at the Lake Skilled Nurse Facility (SNF) evacuated 23 patients; Tulare OES airlifting 4 residents for medical needs

Food, Water, Sheltering:

CA: 29 (+3) shelters open with 426 (+230) occupants

Energy: (Eagle-I, as of 5:30 a.m. ET)

CA: Minimal power outages throughout the impacted area

Transportation:

CA: Over 24 (+4) counties reported road closures


Hazmat:

CA: Two wastewater facilities reported sewage spillage into flood waters

State / Local Response:

- CA EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19, Seismic Activity, Flooding); Governor declared a state of emergency for 21 counties
- NV EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19); Governor declared a State of Emergency for 13 counties and one tribe






FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region IX IMAT-1 / IMAT-2 deployed to CA EOC; 2 LNOs deployed to CA & NV; ESFs 1-12 activated, ESFs 1,3,11 and DoD onsite at CA EOC
- NWC and Region IX RWC in coordination with CA & NV EOCs continue to monitor
- National IMAT Red deploying to CA EOC today
- ISB / SMT deployed to Tracy, CA; ISB / SMT deploying to Carson City, NV today
- US&R Red IST rostered and prepared to deploy; US&R resources with full water rescue capability are available to support R-IX as required.
- FEMA-3592-EM-CA approved on Mar 10 for 34 counties



Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






California – RFC River Forecasts / 5-Day Forecast Rainfall




National Weather Forecast






Snowfall Forecast






Long Range Outlooks – Mar 18-22



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




