





## **Regional Operational Updates**

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#### Region 4 (AL, FL, GA, KY, MS, NC, SC, TN)

#### DR-4684-AL:

- Two Disaster Recovery Center in Selma, Dallas County, will close permanently March 16: DRCs located at Dr. Michael and Catherine Bullock Community Center and Felix Heights Community Center.
- Disaster survivors who are working on their homes can visit Marvin's Hardware Store in Selma to speak with FEMA mitigation specialists about assistance and discuss how to best repair their homes. Most of the information is geared toward do-it-yourself work and general contractors. Available at: Marvin's Hardware Store, 1500 AL-Hwy 14 East, Selma, AL 36703. Dates and times:

#### Region 5 (MN, WI, IL, IN, MI, OH)

#### **East Palestine, Ohio Train Derailment:**

- Due to snow cover, soil sampling efforts were delayed. On March 15th, EPA and Norfolk Southern plan to resume sampling at agricultural, residential, commercial, and recreational properties in both Ohio and Pennsylvania. EPA has highlighted what community members can expect to see during the sampling on their <u>Facebook page</u>.
- Results from the soil sampling are expected about 7-12 days after the samples are taken and will be posted <u>online</u>.
- As of March 12, EPA had conducted 615 home re-entry screenings to date and continues 24/7 air monitoring at 23 stations throughout the community. No detections of vinyl chloride or hydrogen chloride have been identified.

#### Region 6 (AR, LA, OK, NM, TX)

#### Region 6:

• The <u>FEMA Region 6 SPRING RISC 2023</u>, to be held April 11-13<sup>th</sup>, will be focused around "Hurricane Preparedness & Technology in Emergency Management." VALS are partnering with Private Sector and Information Technology Disaster Resource Center (ITDRC) to deliver orientation presentation on who they are, the resources they provide, how to request assistance, and how to coordinate with private sector in blue skies and disaster.

#### DR-4611-LA:

- The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) has announced that operations for the Ida Sheltering Program (non-congregate sheltering program run by the State of Louisiana) are scheduled to end on May 31. This deadline does not impact Ida survivors currently housed in FEMA's Manufactured Housing Units (MHUs) or other programs.
- VALs have received 2509 (+18) referrals; 2464 (+9) of the cases are closed and 45 (-2) are open.
- VALs have received 2912 (+59) Duplication of Benefits requests from disaster case management agencies and have completed 2878 (+43) to date.
- Voluntary agencies report 944 (+139) Homes have been repaired/rebuilt and 335 (-1) homes are pending home repairs/rebuilding.

#### Region 8 (MT, ND, SD, WY, CO, UT)

#### Region 9 (CA, NV, AR, HI, Guam, Northern Mariana, American Samoa)

#### EM-3592-CA:

- Federal disaster assistance has been made available to the state of California to supplement state, tribal and local response efforts due to emergency conditions resulting from severe winter storms, flooding, landslides and mudslides beginning March 9, 2023, and continuing.
- Designated counties: Amador, Butte, El Dorado, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Kern, Lake, Los Angeles, Madera, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Mono, Monterey, Napa, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Francisco, San Mateo, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Sierra, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Tulare, Tuolumne, and Yuba.

# Partnerships in Action: Georgia





On January 12, severe storms with straight-line winds and multiple tornadoes hit Butts, Henry, Jasper, Meriwether, Newton, Pike, Spalding, and Troup counties in Georgia. The <u>Georgia Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster</u> (GA VOAD) led daily virtual response meetings with its members, the emergency management community throughout the State, and other external partners. GA VOAD provided situational awareness reports, identified county needs, and shared partner efforts based on individual capabilities. These included:

- American Red Cross opened three shelters, staffed by Georgia Medical Reserve Corps and Georgia Department of Public Health
  personnel.
- The Salvation Army fed shelter residents, responders, and provided mass feeding in various communities (16,000+ meals).
- Spalding Collaborative organized a disaster relief warehouse for collection and distribution of much needed supplies in Griffin.
- North Georgia United Methodist Conference, Samaritan's Purse, Team Rubicon, Rebuilding Hope, and South Georgia United Methodist Conference deployed relief volunteers to impacted counties to remove debris, tarp roofs, and remove water-damaged items from homes.
- **HOPE Animal-Assisted Crisis Response** brought their comfort animals to schools and disaster recovery centers, where their teams provided support in an overwhelming situation.

GA VOAD continues to support the devastated communities by offering guidance and leadership to set-up local Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COADs) and local Long-Term Recovery Committees. Many of GA VOAD members are also contributing grants or other funding to support long term recovery, including American Red Cross, Lutheran Services, North GA UMC, Rotary Club, and The Salvation Army.

- <u>AmeriCorps Disaster Response Teams</u> and <u>AmeriCorps NCCC</u> are actively responding to communities affected by <u>Hurricane Ian</u>, <u>Hurricane Fiona</u>, <u>Missouri flooding</u>, and other disasters.

### **Tools for Partners: News You Can Use**

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#### **Updates to the National Risk Index**

In late March, FEMA will release major updates to the National Risk Index. Updates will include Census 2020 data and geographies, risk assessment for U.S. territories, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Social Vulnerability data, shifting all scores to percentiles, adding risk metrics for trend analyses and more.

The National Risk Index shows the communities most at risk to 18 natural hazards. FEMA officially launched the National Risk Index in August 2021. Since then, it has become a key tool to helping communities better learn and reduce their risk. It can support mitigation planning, community preparedness and emergency management. #### **FEMA Updates Federal Interagency Operational Plan**



FEMA updated the Federal Interagency Operations Plan for federal disaster response and recovery efforts to support the National Response Framework and National Disaster Recovery Framework.

This is the first time the recovery and response plans have been combined into one plan, providing unity of effort for federal agencies to support state, local, tribal and territorial governments after a disaster.

The plan serves as the federal organizing framework for responding to and recovering from various types of threats and hazards and the unique challenges that they pose. It is a strategic document relying on the operational plans, capabilities and resources of the federal government and does not address all aspects of incident response and recovery.

#### **Podcast Episode Discusses Flood Insurance**

Flooding is America's most frequent disaster, affecting 99% of U.S. counties since 1996. Just one inch of water can cause roughly \$25,000 of damage to one's home and most homeowners don't know their flood risk or what is covered in the event of a flood.

Even more concerning, rising extreme weather has made flooding more prominent and that's not only happening in flood zones. On average, about 40% of NFIP flood insurance claims come from outside high-hazard zones.

FEMA and its National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) protect approximately 4.7 million policyholders across more than 22,500 U.S. communities.
