



Notice of Funding Opportunity

DSHS' Developmental Disabilities Administration seeks to award \$4.5 million in Dan Thompson Memorial Developmental Disabilities Community Services Account grants to organizations providing supports and services in a community setting to benefit people with developmental disabilities eligible for DDA services.

DDA will consider applications that meet the minimum qualifications and focus on one of the pathways:

- Improve or enhance housing related supports, including but not limited to, modifications for accessibility, housing navigators, education/marketing, training curriculum and program development.
- Improve or enhance **recreation**, including but not limited to, yoga, dance, music, arts, camping, sports, education/marketing, training curriculum and program development.
- Improve or enhance **transportation**, including but not limited to, vehicles, education/marketing, training curriculum and program development.

Applications will be accepted until 5 p.m. PST on Friday, Jan. 19, 2024.

The application will open on Dec. 1, 2023, the application guidance, application template, sample contract and a sample application will be available on Dec. 1 at this webpage https://www.ddc.wa.gov/council-activities/dan-thompson-memorial-development-disability-fund. We will send another GovDelivery message at the end of Nov. announcing the opening of the application and its availability.
