Severe Weather - Southern Plains / Great Lakes FINAL

<u>Current Situation:</u> Severe weather impacted a large area from the Southern Plains to the Great Lakes between March 31 to April 2. Strong tornadoes downed trees and power lines, blocking roads, and damaging structures. Local assessments and recovery efforts continue in FEMA Regions IV, V, VI, and VII.





National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook









Snowfall Forecast





Fire Weather Outlook









 The fire began on April 2 and is burning on state and private land in and around the town of Moriarty (population 2,700), 60 miles east of Albuquerque, NM

- Mandatory evacuations for unknown number of people
