WHEREAS, there are approximately 6,890 children in foster care in Kansas; and

WHEREAS, each day foster families, relatives, and kinship caregivers open their homes and hearts to children in foster care, making personal sacrifices to provide these children care, support, and a nurturing environment during difficult times; and

WHEREAS, these individuals deserve to be recognized for the role they play in empowering Kansas children and helping families in foster care overcome their hardships and reconnect; and

WHEREAS, Foster Care Month is an opportunity to honor the tireless work of the public and private child welfare professionals, foster parents, relative and kinship caregivers, tribal organizations, and advocates throughout Kansas that provide children in foster care with the resources, supports, and care they deserve; and

WHEREAS, the state of Kansas recognizes these individuals and all those involved with foster care for their commitment to and work towards the safety, permanency, and well-being of Kansas children and families.
