

## THIS WEEK'S PROGRESS

- On June 1, Gov. Andy Beshear announced due to increased vaccinations, senior centers will reopen at full capacity on June 11.
- As reported on Tuesday, the top five counties by percent of residents vaccinated: Woodford (62%), Franklin (60%), Fayette (58%), Boone (52%) and Scott (51%). The bottom five counties by percent of residents vaccinated: Christian (19%), Spencer (20%), Ballard (21%), McCreary (22%) and Lewis (22%).

## **NEXT WEEK'S GOALS**

 The state's emerging economy is set for liftoff as final capacity restrictions related to COVID-19 end Friday, June 11. The same day, the state will also eliminate the mask mandate for all Kentuckians with the exceptions of places where people are the most vulnerable.
