

## Notice of Emergency Rule WSR #21-02-095

The Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board (Board) extended an emergency rule to implement the Board's ban on the sale of vapor products containing vitamin E acetate as provided in WAC 314-55-1065 and authorized by House Bill (HB) 2826 (Chapter 133, Laws of 2020). Emergency rule WAC 314-55-1055 requires manufacturers of THC products to disclose all compounds (including ingredients, solvents, additives, etc.) used in the production and processing as well as the sources of all vapor products.

Consistent with RCW 34.05.350, any agency may find that the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

An emergency rule adopted under RCW 34.05.350 takes effect upon filing with the code reviser, unless a later date is specified in the order of adoption, and may not remain in effect for longer than one hundred twenty days after filing.

Consistent with RCW 34.05.350(3), within seven days after the rule is adopted, any person may petition the governor requesting the immediate repeal of a rule adopted on an emergency basis by any department listed in RCW 43.17.010. Within seven days after submission of the petition, the governor shall either deny the petition in writing, stating his or her reasons for the denial, or order the immediate repeal of the rule.
