## EDUCATION INFORMATION

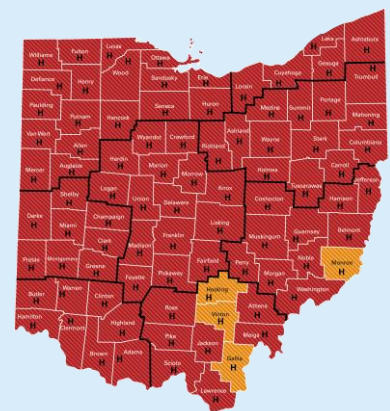
- 411 Ohio school districts are operating with 5-day in-person return to classes.

## TALKING POINTS FOR YOU

- Governor DeWine announced progress toward the goal of getting K-12 students back into the classroom by March 1. In December, 45 percent of Ohio students were attending school remotely full time, but now, fewer than 5 percent of Ohio students are attending classes completely online.
- Despite this progress, the pandemic has taken a toll on academic progress. As the K-12 School Staff Vaccination Program rounds out its third week, Governor DeWine has asked schools and districts to work with their communities to help students advance and make up for any learning that may have been lost or delayed because of the pandemic.

## HOW YOU CAN HELP

- ✓ Set a good example, by wearing a mask, making virtual accommodations and maintaining social distance when meeting face-to-face with others.

- ✓ Submit letters to the editor or local news outlets that support the "COVID-19 Key Messages;" wear a mask, wash hands often and social distance.
- ✓ Participate in local media/radio interviews to support "COVID-19 Key Messages," and help showcase how you and your colleagues are supporting Ohio's Responsible Restart.
