**Review Transition Tip Week 3:** Transition Services are a coordinated set of activities for a child with a disability that are:

- designed to be within a results-oriented process, that is
- focused on improving the academic and functional achievement of the child with a disability to
- facilitate the child's movement from school to post-school activities, including postsecondary education, vocational education, integrated employment (including supported employment); continuing and adult education, adult services, independent living, or community participation;
- based on the individual child's needs, taking into account the child's strengths, preferences, and interests; and Includes
- > instruction,
- related services,
- community experiences,
- > the development of employment and other post-school adult living objectives, and,
- if appropriate, acquisition of daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation. (see link above to access the definition)
