# Changes that can help make the difference....

- Changes have been made to the vacancy information collection from all CQC Registered Care Homes – the system now enables providers set out increased granularity on vacancies that helps make visible those vacancies that are available to take new admissions
- Existing functionality enables providers to declare whether they offer short stay/step down services and integrated analytics in the Capacity Tracker provide visibility of these locations/vacancies
- Reasons why vacancies are not available to take admissions are also provided to aid the broader 'System' understand the pressures, i.e., staffing levels, staff vacancies, safeguarding, Covid or other health outbreak and help target support quickly and appropriately
- Circa 260 Community Rehabilitation providers are also updating their vacancy information daily (Letter to providers from Amanda Pritchard requested daily updates Dec 2022)




## Increasing support and collaboration

- National Provider member organisations, CPA, Care England, NCF are supporting members to increase the frequency of updates to provide discharge teams with confidence that the information provided reflects the vacancy and admission status of the location
- Conditions attached to the <u>ASC Discharge Fund</u> do include providers needing to maintain an accurate picture of their vacancies
- Discharge teams are saving time using the Capacity
  Tracker (see Case Studies, slide 12) and helping to reduce
  the burden for Care Providers by using the Capacity
  Tracker to 'Broker valuable conversations about
  individuals' not to identify a locations vacancy status
- Communication and Provider Support packs, supported by DHSC are being circulated 20<sup>th</sup> January 2023



#### What Care Home Providers update....Services offered





#### **Short Stay/Step Down Services:**

- *In selecting these services, providers are* indicating that they are willing to consider an admission to fill any of their declared long-term vacancies
- The short stay/step down service offer will appear in the 'Find Care Homes' section when a Health and Social Care Professional is searching for a short-stay/step down admission



- Providers will need to select the long term vacancy types they offer
- When selected these will turn green to confirm your selection
- Once completed and saved, the Care Home provider will be taken to the Provider update page -> to input costs, occupancy and vacancy information













They also work in partnership with NECS which runs the Capacity Tracker platform, an essential cloud-based tool that allows users to view provider capacity, bed availability, costs and community provision.

The team required a platform providing 'one source' of data in real-time that could search vacancies, provide bed types and costs and meaningful reports that could be used to help inform discussions regarding patient pathways and placements.
