### **COURTESY ALERT:** Memo - Court Reporter/Transcriptionist Requests

As part of Due Process Hearings, parents have the right to have a record of the hearing and the findings of fact and decisions provided at no cost. The OEC has provided a memo to Petitioners and Respondents that participated in Due Process over the last year, the updated procedures for securing these services via an email from Teresa King, Dispute Resolution Consultant.

Please be sure to forward the attached memo to your local board attorney and/or the attorney with whom you contract for EC matters as a courtesy FYI and to be certain that we have not overlooked any party in need of this information. The <u>REQUIRED</u> corrective action NCEES SLD Course is titled *EC Process Eligibility: Specific Learning Disability.*There is a designated course number for each region and each of the 4 largest PSUs. ### **OPPORTUNITY: Innovative Technology for Early Childhood Assessment**

The COVID-19 pandemic forced practitioners in early intervention and early childhood special education to adopt new ways to conduct assessments. Using technology to administer assessments remotely provided new ways to learn about what children know and can do in everyday situations but it also presented challenges. An unanswered question is can early childhood capitalize on the opportunities technology provides for authentic assessment while addressing issues such as unequal access to technology, limited internet access, and security concerns.

## • April Child Count

EC Directors or Data Managers should review the April 2023 Child Count Report for errors such as duplicate records, incorrect age, grade, setting, and disability. According to the State Auditors, Directors of Exceptional Children Programs and Lead Administrators of Charter schools must certify the child count data. All errors must be corrected, and all Public School Units must certify their submissions no later than April 24, 2023.
