## **Administrative/Supervisory**

#### **Indicator 12**

Indicator 12 captures data on students who received Part C services and were referred to Part B during the July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 reporting period. All students must have an IEP developed within 90 days of the referral and receive services by their 3rd birthday. Indicator 12 must be submitted via spreadsheets by all Traditional LEAs and can be accessed by clicking this link: <a href="Indicator 12 Spreadsheet">Indicator 12 Spreadsheet</a> or by going to the ECATS site under Reporting (<a href="https://www.dpi.nc.gov/districts-schools/classroom-resources/exceptional-children/every-child-accountability-tracking-system-ecats/reporting">https://www.dpi.nc.gov/districts-schools/classroom-resources/exceptional-children/every-child-accountability-tracking-system-ecats/reporting</a>). The spreadsheet has a tab with helpful clarifications to assist LEAs on entering their data and can be submitted at any time prior to the due date of October 30, 2023. Charter Schools and State Operated Programs do not need to submit an Indicator 12 spreadsheet. Only Traditional LEAs are required to submit the completed Indicator 12 spreadsheet. #### **Medicaid Provider Re-certification Information**

PSUs are required to complete the recertification process currently underway at the Division of Health Benefits (DHB). The application requires "documentation showing approval to enroll as a LEA from a local school administrative unit." While we have not been able to ascertain from DHB what documentation meets this requirement, we have learned that some combination of the following has been accepted for PSUs that have successfully recertified:
