6	SECTION 1. Section 1302.002(5-c), Occupations Code, is		
7	amended to read as follows:		
8	(5-c) "Certification training program" means:		
9	(A) a career and technology education program		
10	described by Section 1302.5037; or		
11	(B) a program of education and training that [+		
12	$[\frac{\langle A \rangle}{\langle A \rangle}]$ is accepted or approved by the		
13	department[+] and		
14	[(B)] consists of at least 2,000 hours of a		
15	combination of:		
16	(i) classroom instruction:		
17	(a) at a secondary school;		
18	(b) at an institution of higher		
19	education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or		
20	(c) in an apprenticeship program		
21	accepted by the department; and		
22	(ii) practical experience in air		
23	conditioning and refrigeration-related work under the supervision		
24	of a licensed air conditioning and refrigeration contractor.		

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- 1 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 1302, Occupations Code, is
- 2 amended by adding Section 1302.1015 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1302.1015. RULES REGARDING RENEWAL FEE AND CONTINUING
- 4 EDUCATION EXEMPTIONS FOR CERTAIN LICENSE OR CERTIFICATION HOLDERS.
- 5 The commission shall adopt rules waiving any applicable renewal fee
- 6 and providing for a reduction in the number of hours of continuing
- 7 education required to renew an air conditioning and refrigeration
- 8 contractor license or air conditioning and refrigeration
- 9 technician certification for a person who provides instruction in a
- 10 career and technology education program described by Section
- 11 1302.5037.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 1302.502, Occupations Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 1302.502. EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS. A person is
- 15 not required to be registered or certified under this subchapter to
- 16 act or offer to act as an air conditioning and refrigeration
- 17 technician if the person:
- 18 (1) is a student in a certification training program
- 19 who acts or offers to act as an air conditioning and refrigeration
- 20 technician solely as part of the program; and
- 21 (2) is[÷
- 22 [(A) younger than 18 years of age; or
- [(B)] enrolled at a secondary school or an
- 24 institution of higher education, as that term is defined by Section
- 25 1302.5037.
- SECTION 4. Section 1302.503, Occupations Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 1302.503. SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS FOR TECHNICIANS
- 2 AND MINORS. (a) An air conditioning and refrigeration technician
- 3 must be supervised by an air conditioning and refrigeration
- 4 contractor licensed under this chapter.
- 5 (b) A person who is younger than 18 years of age and acting
- 6 or offering to act as an air conditioning and refrigeration
- 7 technician must at all times work under the direct supervision of a
- 8 licensed air conditioning and refrigeration contractor or a
- 9 certified air conditioning and refrigeration technician.
- SECTION 5. Section 1302.5035(a), Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) An applicant for a technician registration under this
- 13 subchapter must be at least 16 [18] years old.
- 14 SECTION 6. Section 1302.5036, Occupations Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 1302.5036. CERTIFICATION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS.
- 17 To be eligible for an air conditioning and refrigeration technician
- 18 certification, an applicant must:
- 19 (1) be at least 18 years old;
- 20 (2) have completed:
- 21 (A) [in the preceding 48 months] a certification
- 22 training program; or
- 23 (B) 24 months of air conditioning and
- 24 refrigeration-related work:
- 25 (i) under the supervision of a licensed air
- 26 conditioning and refrigeration contractor; or
- 27 (ii) as part of the applicant's military

- 1 occupational specialty within the armed forces of the United
- 2 States; and
- 3 (3) have passed a competency examination
- 4 administered, recognized, or accepted by the department.
- 5 SECTION 7. Subchapter K, Chapter 1302, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 1302.5037 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1302.5037. CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR
- 8 TECHNICIAN CERTIFICATION; INSTRUCTORS. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Career and technology education program" means:
- 10 (A) a career and technology education program
- 11 under Subchapter F, Chapter 29, Education Code; or
- (B) a program determined by the department to be
- 13 similar to that described by Paragraph (A) and offered by:
- 14 <u>(i)</u> an institution of higher education; or
- (ii) a private school, as defined by
- 16 <u>Section 5.001, Education Code.</u>
- 17 (2) "Institution of higher education" means an
- 18 institution of higher education or a private or independent
- 19 institution of higher education, as those terms are defined by
- 20 Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 21 (b) The department shall recognize a career and technology
- 22 education program as a certification training program for purposes
- 23 <u>of Section 1302.5036.</u>
- (c) The commission by rule shall establish standards for the
- 25 essential knowledge and skills of a career and technology education
- 26 program described by Subsection (a), subject to the approval of the
- 27 State Board of Education if the courses are to be offered in a high

- 1 school. The rules must:
- 2 (1) require the program to consist of an appropriate
- 3 number of hours of classroom instruction and a practical component;
- 4 and
- 5 (2) provide for crediting appropriate on-the-job
- 6 training toward meeting the requirements of the practical
- 7 component.
- 8 (d) A person may not provide instruction in a career and
- 9 technology education program unless the person is:
- 10 (1) a licensed air conditioning and refrigeration
- 11 contractor; or
- 12 (2) a certified air conditioning and refrigeration
- 13 technician whose certification was issued on or after September 1,
- 14 2018.
- 15 (e) A career and technology education program offered by an
- 16 institution of higher education may not be more stringent than a
- 17 program offered by a public high school.
- SECTION 8. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 20 adopt rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this
- 21 Act to Chapter 1302, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 9. In developing the initial standards for the
- 23 career and technology education program under Section
- 24 1302.5037(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, the Texas
- 25 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall consult with Texas
- 26 State Technical College and relevant interest groups in the air
- 27 conditioning and refrigeration industry.

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- 1 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 2 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 3 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 4 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 5 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
