The County of Los Angeles is committed to feeding our most vulnerable communities during the Coronavirus pandemic. - Continue to provide nutritious meals to all students at "Grab & Go Food Centers" at 63 locations from 8 a.m. -11 a.m.
- Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon.
- Completed over 102,465 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects.
- To date, the #LetsFeedLACounty initiative has held 9 drive-thru food distribution events, distributing 263 tons of food to 14,634 households.
- 211 food-related calls up 406% from March (2,851) to April (14,486)
- WDACS has experienced a 40% increase in senior meals provided since March.
- DPSS reports a 130% increase in Cal Fresh applications since March
- PHFE reports a 20% increase in WIC applicants since March
- Distribution from the Food Bank's two distribution centers has increased by 80% compared to the first two months of 2020, and this time last year.

STATE PARTNERS	On June 3, 2020, Governor Newsom issued a proclamation declaring a statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, and signed an executive order. To curb the spread of COVID-19, the order ensures in-person voting opportunities are available in sufficient numbers to maintain physical distancing. It requires counties to provide 3 days of early voting, starting the Saturday before election day. The order also requires ballot drop-box locations be available between October 6, 2020, and November 3, 2020, while also allowing counties to consolidate voting locations, with at least one voting location per 10,000 registered voters.
