- The Los Angeles Regional Food Bank’s on-hand food inventory totals 8.5 million pounds, the equivalent of 7 million meals of shelf-stable, perishable and frozen food items, approximately a four-week supply.
- Access Services has completed over 139,484 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects.
- Next Week, #LetsFeedLACounty will host 2 drive-thru food distribution events in the greater Los Angeles Area.
- Continue to provide nutritious meals to all students at “Grab & Go Food Centers” at 63 locations from 8 a.m. -11 a.m.

**Mental Health (DMH):** Developing plans for the reopening of programs and buildings as part of the County reconstitution efforts. Law enforcement System-wide Mental Assessment Response Teams (SMART) and Mental Evaluation Teams (MET) are back on line, but still not operating at 100% due to PD staff remaining assigned to protest activities. LASD MET and PMRT teams are functioning as usual but have been advised to exercise caution New Veteran's Peer Support Line was implemented on June 8, 2020. Wellbeing line for LA County employees and first responders was given its own direct line this week (833-307-0509).
