COVID-19 TESTING	<p style="text-align: center;">Testing is Prioritized and Strongly Encouraged for:</p> <p>Symptomatic persons with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, and Diarrhea. <p>Symptomatic persons who are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hospitalized • Healthcare workers and other first responders • Employees and residents in group living settings, and • Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications <p>Asymptomatic persons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If they are part of a public health investigation • If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters • If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or • If they are an essential worker. <p>Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Once again, please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As of 7/22/20, Access Services has completed over 220, 631 meal and grocery deliveries to seniors and people with disabilities across four current projects. • This week, #LetsFeedLACounty hosted 1 drive-thru food distribution event in San Fernando. • To date, at 19 events, #LetsFeedLACounty has distributed 1,121 tons of food to 34,972 households. • Drive-thru food distribution events have been extended through the end of August. • Drive-thru food distribution events held in El Monte and Long Beach served 3,139 and 2,829 households, respectively, were each provided 60 pounds of food, including shelf-stable items, frozen meat, and fresh produce. • The LAUSD “Grab & Go” Food Centers are open, Monday through Friday from 8-11a.m. through August 14, 2020. As of Monday, June 22, 2020, the “Grab & Go Food Center” at Verdugo Hills High School moved to Mount Gleason Middle School. • Issuing additional CalFresh benefits up to the maximum allowed per family and allowing CalFresh recipients to purchase groceries online for delivery from Walmart and Amazon. • Great Plates Delivered has a current service population of 3,357 seniors (38% increase since last month) with a total of 392,361 meals served. • Great Plates Program has been extended until August 10, 2020. • Elder Nutrition Program has a current service current population of 16,657 seniors.
