

ACT National Test on April 4 Rescheduled to June 13, 2020

Frequently Asked Questions

Is ACT still holding its April 4, 2020 national test?

No. ACT has rescheduled its April 4 national test date to June 13 across the U.S. in response to concerns about the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19). All students registered for the April 4 test date will receive an email from ACT in the next few days informing them of the postponement and instructions for free rescheduling to June 13 or a future national test date.

What happens next for students who were registered to take the ACT in April?

All students registered for the April 4 test date will receive an email from ACT in the next few days informing them of the postponement and instructions for free rescheduling to June 13 or a future ACT national test date.

When are the next ACT national test dates?

The next ACT national test dates are June 13 and July 18.

Will ACT automatically register impacted students for the next ACT test date?

No. All students registered for the April 4 test date will receive an email from ACT in the next few days informing them of the instructions for free rescheduling to June 13 or a future ACT national test date.

What will happen if students can't take the ACT on one of the future test dates or don't wish to reschedule their test?

Students who can't or don't wish to reschedule may receive a refund of their April registration fee.

What will ACT do for high school seniors who are applying for fall 2020 college admissions and are facing deadlines?
