Winners will be awarded on Monday, January 18, 2021 at the State of Iowa Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration in Des Moines.


The first prize winner from each grade division may have his or her piece submitted to the Des Moines Register for possible publication.

Call to Volunteer Service

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., one of the great civil rights leaders, recognized the power and ability of community to achieve common goals when united in the belief of justice. Today, his legacy is honored in a federal holiday commemorating his achievements, but also encouraging a national day of service reflecting his teachings in nonviolence and social justice. Instead of a day off, people of all ages are encouraged to make it a day ON, where people can come together to improve lives, bridge social barriers and help cultivate the image of community Dr. King envisioned.

Dr. King stated, “Human progress is neither automatic nor inevitable...Every step toward the goal of justice requires sacrifice, suffering and struggle; the tireless exertions and passionate concern of dedicated individuals.” Civic engagement refers not only to individual volunteerism, but includes efforts to directly address a public issue while working with others in the community. This MLK Day, you are called to make a difference in your community and the world.

Contest Rules

All entries must be submitted on or before Friday, **December 18, 2020**.

Any entry received after this date will not be accepted into the contest. Only one entry per individual or group.

- All art, photography, or videos must include a one paragraph explanation of how the entry relates to the subject content
- Videos must be recorded on CD, DVD, or YouTube and submitted electronically (1-3 minutes in length)

Submission Guidelines

- All entries may be hand-written or typed. Typed entries must be double spaced and use at least an 11 point font.
- Official cover sheet must be attached to the entry.
- Contestants must have their parents' or guardians' permission and signature on the cover sheet, waiver/release form, and copyright transfer agreement, in the event that the piece is published in newspapers or on the internet.
