COVID-19 TESTING

Testing is Prioritized and Strongly Encouraged for:

Symptomatic persons with:

• Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, and Nausea or Vomiting.

Symptomatic persons who are:

- Hospitalized
- Healthcare workers and other first responders
- Employees and residents in group living settings, and
- Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications

Asymptomatic persons:

- If they are part of a public health investigation
- If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters
- If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or
- If they are an essential worker.

Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.

As of 12/8/2020, approximately 3,954,974 people in Los Angeles County have been tested for COVID-19. Eleven percent (11%) of those who have been tested have tested positive for COVID-19.

As of December 2, 2020, Access Services has completed 303,807 deliveries of meals, grocery boxes, and paper goods to people with disabilities and seniors across all projects to date. Total distributed to date at 59 events: 3,195 tons of food which is the equivalent 5.3 million meals provided to 97,614 households. #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program. Great Plates Program extends until 12/8/2020 and has a current service population: 8,152 seniors. Total meals served through this program since 5/12/2020: 2,570,715 The Great Plates Delivered Program has contracted with 76 meal providers that are employing 1,763 people. 67% of meal providers are minority-owned businesses.
