## **STEP 2: WILDFIRE ASH AND DEBRIS REMOVAL**

The State of Oregon will cover the cost of debris cleanup from the September 2020 wildfires, even if the costs are not fully covered by the Federal Emergency Management Administration. The following chart shows the types of debris that are eligible or ineligible for homes and businesses in Step 2 of the cleanup.
