School-Based Mental Health Policy

In June of 2020, <u>Session Law 2020-7</u> was approved by the North Carolina General Assembly. It is an act to require the State Board of Education to adopt a school-based mental health policy and to require k-12 school units to adopt and to implement a school-based mental health plan that includes a mental health training program and a suicide risk referral protocol.

The NC State Board of Education then adopted <u>SHLT-003:School-</u> <u>Based Mental Health Policy</u> that aligns with legislation and details compliance requirements.

The mental health plan will address the following topics:

- A. Youth mental health
- B. Suicide prevention
- C. Substance abuse
- D. Teenage dating violence and, in accordance with SL 2019-245,
- E. Child sexual abuse prevention and
- F. Sex trafficking prevention
