| | Symptomatic persons with: Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, and Nausea or Vomiting. | | |
| | Symptomatic persons who are: Hospitalized Healthcare workers and other first responders Employees and residents in group living settings, and Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications | | |
| | Asymptomatic persons: If they are part of a public health investigation If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or If they are an essential worker. | | |

As of 1/5/2021, approximately 4,825,956 people in Los Angeles County have been tested for COVID-19. Sixteen percent (16%) of those who have been tested have tested positive for COVID-19.

As of July 1, 2020, DHS has assumed the role of operational lead for the County's Medical Sheltering program from the CEO's Office of Emergency Management (OEM).
