Testing highly recommended for:

- **People who have symptoms**: If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a healthcare provider and get tested.
- People who have been a close contact to someone with confirmed or suspected
 COVID-19 (a case) within the last 14 days. Even if your test is negative, you will still need to complete your quarantine.
- People with or without symptoms who are part of an outbreak response or contact investigation in high-risk settings, such as nursing homes, congregate living facilities, correctional facilities, or persons experiencing homelessness.

VACCINE & DISTRIBUTION

LA County is currently in Phase 1A of vaccination efforts and is projected to move into Phase 1B beginning in early February. The COVID-19 vaccine is free for everyone and offered to different groups in phases. It is likely to be available to the general public in Spring/Summer 2021. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department:
