COVID-19 DISEASE OUTBREAK DETERMINATION

Pursuant to ORS 743A.264(2), I have determined that an outbreak of respiratory illness, called COVID-19, caused by SARS-CoV-2 is occurring in Oregon. A disease outbreak is defined in state law as a significant or notable increase in the number of cases of a disease. ORS 431A.005.

On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization declared the outbreak a "public health emergency of international concern." On January 31, 2020, the U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19. Oregon Governor Kate Brown declared a statewide emergency on March 8, 2020, and has extended the declaration of emergency since that time.

As of today, there have been 139,355 cases and 1,904 deaths associated with COVID-19 in Oregon, with case counts rising daily.

Two safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines are currently approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) under Emergency Use Authorizations. Both vaccines are currently available to eligible individuals in Oregon. More COVID-19 vaccines may become available following clinical trials and approval by the FDA.

Therefore, having determined there exists a disease outbreak and that vaccination is necessary to prevent the spread of COVID-19, the cost of vaccination for COVID-19 shall be covered by insurance in accordance with ORS 743A.264 (2) and (3).

This determination is effective on the date it is signed and remains in effect until I find that the disease outbreak is at an end and issue an order terminating this determination.
