

# Oregon vaccinations: Current numbers



Number of people vaccinated (at least 1 dose): 1,073,369 (25 percent/80 percent of current eligibles)

National average: 26 percent\*

Total population fully vaccinated (2 shots/J&J): 579,122 (12 percent)

National average: 12 percent\*

Oregon daily average doses administered: 26,268

Percentage of all seniors vaccinated: 66 percent (508,250 total – as of March 25th)



# **Updated Eligibility Timelines: Phase 1B and Phase 2**

#### Phase 1B Started on January 25, 2021

#### **Groups 1-5**

- Childcare providers, early learning and K–12 educators and staff
- · People 65 and older

#### **Group 6**

### Eligible no later than March 29, 2021

- Adults 45–64 with one or more underlying health conditions with increased risk\*
- Migrant and seasonal farm workers
- · Seafood and agricultural workers
- Food processing workers
- People living in low-income senior housing, senior congregate and independent living
- Individuals experiencing houselessness (sheltered and unsheltered)
- People currently displaced by wildfires
- Wildland firefighters
- Pregnant people 16 and older

### **Group 7**

### Eligible no later than April 5, 2021

- Frontline workers as defined by CDC\*\*
- People age 50 and older residing in a multigenerational household
  - » Multigenerational household means a household where:
    - People from three or more generations live, such as a home where an elder lives with a parent and grandchild; or
    - An individual or individuals 50 years and older residing with and caring for a relative who is not their own child (i.e. a grandchild, niece or nephew)
- Adults 16–44 with one or more underlying health conditions with increased risk\*

### Eligible no later than May 1, 2021

All people who are 16 and older



### High Level Forecast (First Dose Supply vs. Eligible Population)






# **Vaccination Rates By County**

Click on a county below to filter the data on the right and below. Click again to clear the filter.






People vaccinated per 10,000: lighter colors represent counties with lower vaccination rates, while darker colors represent counties with higher vaccination rates.

\*\*Doses administered during this time may not yet be reported.








# **Hospitalizations by Severity**

#### Oregon's Hospitalization Trends by Severity




# **COVID-19 Risk Levels by County**



Note: Josephine County qualifies for Extreme Risk but is given a two-week caution period at High Risk because it moved down from Extreme Risk in the last movement period. Klamath County qualifies for High Risk but is given a two-week caution period at Moderate Risk because it moved down from Extreme Risk in the last movement period.
