Winter Highlights Through 6AM Thursday

What

- Heaviest mountain snow Wednesday morning and afternoon
- Minor snow accumulations possible for the lower elevations, mainly over the north Wednesday and across both central and northern Wyoming Wednesday night

Where


- Winter Storm Warning for the Bighorn Mountains
- Winter Weather Advisories for the Absaroka, Teton, and Gros Ventre Ranges and Yellowstone National Park

When

- Greatest impacts through Wednesday
- Lighter snow lingers after sunset Wednesday to sunrise Thursday



Expected Snowfall

6AM Wednesday through 6PM Thursday



Key Points



The heaviest snow occurs in the Bighorn Range and eastern Absaroka Mountains between 10 AM and 7 PM Wednesday, with snow rates of 1-2 inches per hour at times.

Highest totals occur in the central Bighorn Range, where an additional foot is likely (80%). Totals of 8 to 14 inches will fall in the higher terrain of the Absaroka Mountains from west of Cody to around Kirwin.

Snow over lower elevations, such as in Buffalo and Cody, will have difficulty sticking, mainly keeping to grassy areas. That is why there is a larger "expected snowfall" range for these areas. Rain or a mix is favored during the daylight hours.

Travel Impacts



Powder River Pass and Granite Pass over the Bighorn Range will be most impacted by the heavy snow, with lesser impacts over Teton and Togwotee Passes.

> Plan ahead! Check the forecast. Give yourself extra time.



Low and High End Snowfall Amounts


6AM Wednesday through 6PM Thursday


High End Amount 10% Chance of Higher Snow Amounts

Colder Temperatures for Several Days


Highs 5-10 degrees below average, especially east of Divide
