On or about January 11, 2024, the crime of AGGRAVATED TRAFFICKING OF A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE, was committed by KANGBIN LEE, who knowingly aided, promoted, or encouraged the possession of in excess of one thousand (1000) pounds of marijuana, a Schedule I controlled dangerous substance, at Monster Farms, LLC, 3201 N 214<sup>th</sup> Street W, Haskell, in Muskogee County, Oklahoma, contrary to the provisions of Section 2–415(C)(1)(b) of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Oklahoma.
