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




Draft Budget for the Common Agricultural Policy

- Agricultural crisis reserve 400 mil. EUR/year




Requirements and standards compared to competitive countries




Costs of agricultural standards and regulations (III)




- Accumulated costs of the herein included standards and regulations
 - While avoiding double counting, costs for all included environmental standards and regulations amount to over 5.2 billion EUR or 315 EUR/ha in Germany.
























Management and monitoring of the CAP

1. New delivery model and the result-based system

- clear, specific and quantified EU objectives for which achievement can be measured,
- measures that are clearly linked to objectives,
- a fully developed set of output, result and impact indicators,
- requirements for Member States to compile reliable and comparable statistics on disposable farm income,
- transparent criteria for assessing the content and quality of the CAP strategic plans,
- performance-based payments to the Member States.



Management and monitoring of the CAP

- 1. New delivery model and the result-based system
 - Clear, specific and quantified objectives measuring achievement
 - performance evaluation x evaluation of legality (2 systems)
 - Simplification?
- 2. Another controled points
 - Active/genuine farmer
 - Capping

= NO simplification



Management and monitoring of the CAP

3. Sanction system for conditionality

The Early warning system

- should offer more guidance and more possibilities to correct errors in advance,
- there should be an upper limit for penalties imposed on farmers,
- should be provide a time period during which farmers can voluntarily correct possible errors in their aid application.



Conclusion:

- 1. The main challenge of the new CAP is environmental protection and climate change and farmers are ready to participate,
- 2. Without a strong budget (and crisis reserve) it will not be possible to fill it,
- 3. The proposal for new CAP speaks of performance evaluation and achievement of objectives, at the same time, however, it proposes measures that are not related to performance
- 4. On the contrary, it creates pressure for greater profitability with negative pressure and impact on the environment
- 5. The proposal does not guarantee the simplification of the CAP, but creates a dual evaluation system
