Oregon's Weekly Surveillance Summary Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)



COVID-19 Weekly Report data will be finalized every Sunday at 11 p.m. PDT. and the report will be published the following Tuesday. Please note that the data reported here are continually being updated. For daily up-to-date information visit the <a href="OHA COVID-19">OHA COVID-19</a> web page.

As of 11 p.m. on Sunday, April 12, there have been 1,574 cases of COVID-19 reported to the Oregon Health Authority. Not all cases have been interviewed at the time of this report. These data represent a snapshot of COVID-19 risk factors, clinical and demographic characteristics and include data on cases with pending investigations. The data shown in this report comes from Orpheus, which is an electronic disease surveillance system for reportable diseases for the state of Oregon.




Figure 3. COVID-19 cases by sex (n=1574)

Figure 1 provides information on signs and symptoms from all COVID-19 cases. The two most commonly reported symptoms are cough (n=1041, 66.1%) and fever (n=788, 50.1%). Figure 2 provides information on risk factors from all COVID-19 cases. The two most common risk factors are having underlying conditions (n=555, 35.3%) and contact with a known COVID-19 case prior to symptom onset (n=436, 27.7%). It is important to note that each person may report more than one sign/symptom or risk factor. Figures 3 shows the sex distribution of all COVID-19 cases.

\*Congregate living situations include, but are not limited to, long-term care facilities, group homes, prisons, shelters, etc. Data include people with confirmed cases who live or work in congregate living situations.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Underlying conditions include cardiovascular disease, chronic liver disease, chronic lung disease, chronic renal disease, current or former smoker, diabetes mellitus, immunocompromised condition, neurologic/neurodevelopmental condition, or other chronic diseases.

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#### Weekly long-term care facility and senior living communities report

OHA will begin publishing data on cases and deaths in DHS-licensed long-term care facilities as well as non-DHS-regulated congregate living facilities (i.e., senior living communities) that have 3 or more confirmed COVID-19 cases or one or more death. This list does not include correctional facilities.

There is one adult foster home that has 3 or more confirmed COVID-19 cases or one or more death.
