

Milestone: Average Daily Cases

50 case threshold is consistent with nationally recognized standards.






Milestone: Testing Capacity

Testing capacity remains significantly above target.

Tests are rising on average compared to seven days ago, and we are above our daily goal.







Milestone: Positivity Rate


Positivity rate is declining and is under key threshold of 5%.

Positive test rates are rising on average compared to seven days ago, but we are still below our threshold.









Milestone: Hospital Capacity

Region 1 hospitals have capacity.



Available beds are below the marker where we are at risk for exceeding our capacity.



Available ICU beds are below the marker where we are at risk for exceeding our capacity.



Phase Three Considerations

Key factors in policy making



Outdoor activities are safer than indoor activities

Timed, seated events are safer than uncontrolled gatherings





Some indoor activities have not been linked to significant public outbreak

Policies should not increase health or economic inequities





Staged Approach

Time between each stage to evaluate the impacts of easing restrictions.

Phase 3.1 Details

75% Capacity with Social Distancing

- · Beauty salons, barber shops, and nail salons
- Libraries
- Museums, zoos, aquariums
- · Office buildings and businesses
- Restaurants
- Shopping malls and retail stores
- Tattoo, massage, and esthetician services

Alcohol Sales

- Bars allowed to sell to-go drinks from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- Package liquor sales in the French Quarter limited to 8 a.m. through 11 p.m.

Gathering Sizes

Indoor: 50 peopleOutdoor: 100 people

Enhanced Outdoor Seating Options

- Sidewalk Café Outdoor Dining Grant
- Curbside Dining and Parklet Pilot
- Safe and Social French Market Place
