

# ATI INCUBATION ACADEMY

Fact Sheet

## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The ATI Incubation Academy aims to expand and create additional capacity within the community to deliver prevention and intervention services to justice involved individuals in communities with the greatest need. Created by the ATI Office, the academy will provide training, funding and technical assistance to smaller grassroots organizations in the County, with a focus on those run by underrepresented groups, including those with lived experience. This program impacts multiple intercepts across the Sequential Intercept Model (the strategic framework for the County's reimagining of the justice system and push to more community-based care), as it addresses the supply bottlenecks in housing and treatment that preclude judicial officers from being able to offer more individuals care as an alternative to incarceration.

## TARGET AUDIENCE

Small grassroots organizations that serve justice-involved individuals and provide:

- Housing
- Treatment services
- Case management

Target CBOs led by underrepresented groups, including justice involved individuals.

Small CBOs earn compensation for services provided while participating in the academy

#### **HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?**

- New and existing community-based organizations (CBOs) will be invited to apply to the Incubation Academy, with focused outreach to organizations run by Black, Latinx, and justice involved individuals.
- 30-40 organizations will be chosen to take part in the program.
- Academy participants receive training and technical assistance in building organizational capabilities, expertise in justice operating procedures and County contracting readiness.
- Participants are mentored by seasoned CBOs who have experience contracting with the County.
- During the program, participants will partner with system navigators in Court to provide judicial officers alternatives to incarceration.
- Through subcontracting relationships with larger mentor organizations, participants will deliver – and be paid for – beds and treatment services provided to justice involved individuals while participating in the academy.

# **EXAMPLE TRAINING TOPICS**

- County contracting principles
- Principles of non-profit organizational management
- Fundamentals of budget preparation and management
- Internal controls and safeguard best practices
- Court/program reporting standards
- Using data to track services and outcomes

## **PILOT DETAILS**

- Listening sessions and community feedback via web portal, email and surveys is ongoing from April to July 2021.
- The ATI Incubation Academy application will be released in July 2021.
- Cohort 1 of 15-20 organizations will begin classes in September 2021.
- Additional cohorts will begin January 2022, May 2022, and September 2022.

# LOCAL INITIATIVES SUPPORT CORPORATION (LISC)

The ATI Office has engaged <u>LISC</u> and its local affiliate <u>LISC LA</u> as the third-party administrator (TPA) for the ATI Incubation Academy. The TPA's role consists of the following:

- Administer funds to lead providers to lead and expand diversion programs across LA County.
- Design and implement the ATI Incubation Academy to include both organizational capacity building and technical assistance.
