# <u>Professional Learning Opportunity: Literacy Framework for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities</u>

The Literacy Framework for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities professional learning (PL) is aligned with research based in the Science of Reading as well as evidence-based practices for literacy instruction for students with significant cognitive disabilities (SCD) who are accessing the general curriculum through the Extended Content Standards. Current research supports the vast majority of students with SCD can learn literacy skills when research validated instructional and learning techniques are effectively employed.

In this PL, participants will:

- explore evidence-based practices, structures and planning tools to support and enhance literacy acquisition skills for students with SCD.
- unpack North Carolina Extended Content Standards.
- apply informal assessment to case studies.
- use assessment information to plan for instruction across the curriculum.
- utilize a guiding rubric for literacy instruction.
- create a holistic classroom schedule embedding literacy.

The format for this course will be a blended model of adult learning which includes three face-to-face days as well as asynchronous assignments. Participants will be expected to complete all face-to-face days and all assignments. Participants will attend days one and two, then break for a period in order to apply the content with students with which they work, before returning for day three. At the end of this series participants will be awarded 2.4 CEUs. Participants must be able to attend all sessions; partial credit will not be awarded. **Attendance is limited to the first 30 registrants for each location.** If registration is full for the location you select, you will have the option to be placed on a waitlist or select a new location. #### **Class Size/Caseload Waivers**

As a reminder, the policy, NC 1508-1 Class Size: School Age and Preschool, requires that a request for waiver be submitted to the Office of Exceptional Children (OEC) whenever the "pupil-teacher ratio for a class period/caseload exceeds requirements."

During school closures and the subsequent reopening of schools, the OEC did not publish waiver submission windows and responded to requests for waivers on a case-by-case basis. Given the current shortage of EC Teachers and Related Service Providers, the OEC plans to continue this practice. Therefore, PSUs may submit a request for waiver to the assigned Program Monitoring Consultant or the Consultant(s) for Related Service, as appropriate. The directions for requesting a class size or caseload waiver and updated waiver forms have been posted to the OEC website and attached for your convenience. (ATTACHED)

#### IDEA Funds and Overtime Pay

Overtime pay for classified employees is an allowable expense in federal grants. For the classified employee to receive overtime pay out of federal funds the employee is required to be serving students with disabilities 100% of the time. If the employee is serving non-disabled students in any capacity, then the overtime cannot be paid out of federal funds.

## PRC 118 Autism Funding Request for Funding

The Office of Exceptional Children allocates PRC 118 Autism (AU) funding to assist Public School Units (PSUs) to increase capacity in the implementation of an effective autism program to improve outcomes for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

There are two levels of support and funding available, General Support or Team Support. PSUs can choose which level based on their priorities regarding autism programming and in alignment with their LEA Self-Assessment.

The General Support level will allow PSUs to access ASD specific professional learning (PL) for the purpose of increasing educators' knowledge and use of evidence-based programming in the provision of services to students with ASD.

The Team Support level is available for PSUs to:

- Access PL for the purpose of increasing educators' implementation of effective services to students with ASD.
- Develop or maintain an Autism Support Team (AST) with the skills needed to provide support within the PSU.
- Provide PL and ongoing support (including but not limited to consultation, coaching, PLCs, etc.) within the PSU.

Funding amounts allocated will be dispersed in a lump sum based on PSU Average Daily Membership (ADM). A memo outlining acceptable use of funding will be disseminated when allocations are disbursed.

## House Bill 1030 Consent for Release of Information to the Residential Schools for the Deaf and Blind

Districts should be in the process of disseminating the annual release of information form to parents of students who are eligible as DeafBlind, Deaf, Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, or Multiply Disabled with a vision and/or hearing loss. The form must be distributed to parents by October 1, 2022. Parents who provide a yes consent to receive more information about the schools must be reported using the electronic reporting tool by November 30, 2022. The HB 1030 Memo, electronic reporting tool, and complimentary consent forms in English and Spanish may be found on the Federal Regulations & State Policies webpage under the Forms tab and then Supplemental Forms.
