# Professional Learning Opportunity: Literacy Framework for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities

The Literacy Framework for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities professional learning (PL) is aligned with research based in the Science of Reading as well as evidence-based practices for literacy instruction for students with significant cognitive disabilities (SCD) who are accessing the general curriculum through the Extended Content Standards. Current research supports the vast majority of students with SCD can learn literacy skills when research validated instructional and learning techniques are effectively employed.

In this PL, participants will:

- explore evidence-based practices, structures and planning tools to support and enhance literacy acquisition skills for students with SCD.
- unpack North Carolina Extended Content Standards.
- apply informal assessment to case studies.
- use assessment information to plan for instruction across the curriculum.
- utilize a guiding rubric for literacy instruction.
- create a holistic classroom schedule embedding literacy.

The format for this course will be a blended model of adult learning which includes three face-to-face days as well as asynchronous assignments. Participants will be expected to complete all face-to-face days and all assignments. Participants will attend days one and two, then break for a period in order to apply the content with students with which they work, before returning for day three. At the end of this series participants will be awarded 2.4 CEUs. Participants must be able to attend all sessions; partial credit will not be awarded. Attendance is limited to the first 30 registrants for each location. If registration is full for the location you select, you will have the option to be placed on a waitlist or select a new location. #### **Bookshare**

Bookshare is the largest online Accessible Media Producer for various <u>accessible formats</u>, including braille, large print, audio and e-pub. Student eligibility is unique, based on copyright laws, and specific qualified professionals in schools can determine a student's eligibility. This <u>presentation on Bookshare</u> demonstrates how this free service can positively impact reading skills for qualified students. ## House Bill 1030 Consent for Release of Information to the Residential Schools for the Deaf and Blind

Districts should be in the process of disseminating the annual release of information form to parents of students who are eligible as DeafBlind, Deaf, Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, or Multiply Disabled with a vision and/or hearing loss. The form must be distributed to parents by October 1, 2022. Parents who provide a yes consent to receive more information about the schools must be reported using the electronic reporting tool by November 30, 2022. The HB 1030 Memo, electronic reporting tool, and complimentary consent forms in English and Spanish may be found on the Federal Regulations & State Policies webpage under the Forms tab and then Supplemental Forms. #### Exit Count

All Public-School Units are responsible for certifying the Child Exit Count: September in ECATS. The certification schedule for the Exit Count opened September 15, 2022 and is due by close of business September 30, 2022.

#### Indicator 11

All Public-School Units are responsible for certifying Indicator 11: Child Find in ECATS. The certification schedule for Indicator 11 begins October 3, 2022 and is due by close of business October 31, 2022.

#### Indicator 12

Indicator 12 must be submitted via spreadsheet by all Traditional Public-School Units prior to the due date of October 31, 2022. Charter Schools and State Operated Programs do not need to submit an Indicator 12 spreadsheet this year. # • IDEA Funds and Overtime Pay

Overtime pay for classified employees is an allowable expense in federal grants. For the classified employee to receive overtime pay out of federal funds the employee is required to be serving students with disabilities 100% of the time. If the employee is serving non-disabled students in any capacity, then the overtime cannot be paid out of federal funds.

## IDEA Grant and Budget Update

The Object Code 122 EC-Salary-Interim Teacher-Non-Certified has been removed from the Chart of Accounts for all federal EC Funds. EC Teachers paid from federal funds are required to hold licensure in Exceptional Children.

# **Applications for Model Programming Sites for Autism Spectrum Disorder**

The Autism Model Program Site (AMPS) initiative is intended to increase capacity in the implementation of an effective autism program to improve outcomes for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Using an Implementation Science framework, NCDPI autism consultants work collaboratively with selected Public School Units (PSUs) to leverage existing infrastructure and resources, such as the Autism Support Team, to address critical components of capacity building.

We are pleased to announce that a new cohort will be added for the 2022-2023 year. To begin the process of becoming an Autism Model Program Site, your PSU will need to complete the application as a team. Selected applicants will receive an additional \$3,000.00 in PRC 118 Autism funding to support the requirements of being a part of this initiative.
