All anglers sport fishing in salt waters of Southeast Alaska must have on board and readily available for use a functional deepwater release device to return **ALL ROCKFISH** that are not harvested to the depth of capture, or to at least 100 feet, whichever is shallower.

COMMON SLOPE ROCKFISH




REDBANDED

- Thick red bands
- One eye bar



VERMILION

- Thick base of tail
- Rough, scaly lower jaw



SILVERGRAY

- Large projecting lower jaw with large knob



ROUGHEYE

- Dark splotch on gill plate
- Rough spines under eye
- Usually caught at depths greater than 400 feet



SHORTRAKER

- Gill rakers short. No splotch on gill plate
- Usually caught at depths greater than 400 feet

PELAGIC ROCKFISH



BLACK

- Blue-black with white belly




DARK

- Uniformly blue-black



DUSKY

- Mouth to mid-eye with small knob



WIDOW

- Small mouth
- Relatively slim



YELLOWTAIL

- Fins washed yellow

DEMERSAL SHELF ROCKFISH (DSR) OF SOUTHEAST ALASKA

ALL ANGLERS: NO RETENTION OF YELLOWEYE



YELLOWEYE

- Bright yellow eye. Dark edges on fins

QUILLBACK

- Freckles on head/throat
- Yellow saddle markings on spines



CANARY

- Light lateral line
- Anal fin slanted back



CHINA

- Broad yellow stripe along lateral line starting on dorsal fin



COPPER

- Light colored stripe along rear 2/3 of lateral line



TIGER

- Thin red-brown bands
- Two eye bars



ROSETHORN

- Light spots on upper back
