



**Mission: Help families learn to grow food.**

1. Shady gathering: Walunt tree provides shade over a gathering area.
2. Limestone benches: Large blocks of limestone provide seating and help residents reach fruit in nearby trees.
3. Water spigot: Spigot provides water for gardeners.
4. Washing station: Sink and table for washing produce. Nearby water spigot provides water for gardens.
5. Tool storage: A large chest provides storage for shared tools. A combination to the lock is given to gardeners.
6. Materials depot: Woodchip mulch, leaf mulch and compost are placed in this location for use in the garden.
7. Compost bins: Two bins provide an area for garden debris.
8. Raised bed: 18" tall and 3' wide. Grows annual vegetables and herbs.
9. Fruit trees and berry bushes: Food is available to harvest by anyone.
10. Stepping stones: Large limestone stepping stones allow easy access through a dense, low-growing ground cover.
11. Arbor: Supports grape vines and creates a tunnel effect through fruit trees.
12. Monarch gardens: A diversity of low-growing, native prairie plants provide beautiful blooms loved by butterflies throughout the year.
13. Kiosk: A kiosk communicates garden announcements.
