## DEFEAT DRAFTS.

Check windows and doors for drafts, then <u>add weather stripping</u>, <u>caulk</u>, <u>or use</u> <u>a draft guard</u> to fix air leaks.



#### REPLACE FURNACE FILTER.

Make it easier for your furnace to move warm air throughout the house. <u>Install a clean, new filter</u> now and again in January.



#### WEATHERIZE WINDOWS.

<u>Install window film</u> or storm windows to help keep warm air indoors and Jack Frost outside.



## LIGHT THE WAY.

Longer winter nights add up to more time with the lights on. Replace old bulbs with energy efficient LEDs to save on energy and costs.



### DON'T FORGET THE FAN.

<u>Change ceiling fans to rotate clockwise</u> in cold weather. This helps push warm air back down to where the people are.
