
## Why a $\mathbf{POPPY}$ ?

You can color the poppy any color you'd like — even write the name of a veteran you're honoring in the petals. Then display it proudly in your window for all to see.


Colors of poppies on lapels you may see today and their meaning:

Red poppy: Memorial to World War One and following conflicts

Purple poppy: To remember animal victims of war

Black poppy: Remembering African, black and Caribbean communities' contribution

White poppy: Remembers people who died in conflict with a focus on an end to war
